183 North Mobility Project

Advancing Express Lanes and No-Build Alternatives

- Two Express Lanes in each direction
- Direct connectors at the SH 45 North interchange and the MoPac interchange
- Four continuous general purpose lanes
- \$5 million in bicycle and pedestrian accommodations
- Next Technical Working Group scheduled for Feb. 24, 2015
- Next Open House is March 5, 2015 at Westwood High School








MoPac South Environmental Study


- Advancing Express Lanes and No-Build Alternatives at next Open House scheduled for Feb. 26, 2015 at Hill Country Middle School
 - Two lanes in each direction
 - Direct connectors at Cesar Chavez Street
 - Best Management Practices for construction over Lady Bird Lake, Barton Creek and the Aquifer
 - Bicycle and pedestrian accommodations south of Loop 360
- Held Technical Work Group
 meeting on Dec. 3, 2015





MoPac Intersections Study

- Study was elevated from a Categorical Exclusion to an Environmental Assessment and the funding agreement with TxDOT to accommodate increased efforts has been executed
- Release of draft Environmental Assessment and Public Hearing planned for Spring 2015
 - Increase in stakeholder outreach to support these activities






SH 45SW Environmental Study

- Final Environmental Impact Statement released on Jan. 23, 2015
- Barton Springs/Edwards Aquifer Conservation Dist. will vote on revised Consent Decree with TxDOT on Feb. 12, 2015
- The Record of Decision (ROD) is the final action in the environmental approval process and clears the project for final design and construction
- ROD anticipated in Feb. 2015





Bergstrom Expressway

- Held Public Hearing on Nov. 19, 2014
- Final Environmental Assessment released on Jan. 9, 2015
- Finalized Large Oak Tree Best Management Practices
- Record of Decision anticipated in Feb. 2015
- Design/Build procurement activities ongoing





Oak Hill Parkway

- Technical Working Group met on Dec. 3, 2014
- Held Open House Jan. 20, 2015
 - Advanced two build concepts as well as no build
 - More than 100 attendees
 - Over 300 participated online
 - Unanimous OHAN resolution of support for project
- Water quality and bike/pedestrian workshops as well as value engineering study planned for this spring
