


Express Lane Performance






Current Progress in Construction Work Areas

- 2000 CAMPO included the MoPac South Project in the 2025 Long Range Transportation Plan (also included in 2005, 2010, 2015 plans)
- 2011 Rider 42 passed, which focused on the top 50 most congested corridors in Texas – MoPac is listed as 37th
- 2011 Senator Kirk Watson formed a Mobility Investment Priorities Committee for Central Texas including representatives from CAMPO, Capital Metro, TxDOT, City of Austin, and the Mobility Authority
- 2013 Committee recommends providing \$16.5 million to study MoPac South from Lady Bird Lake to Slaughter Lane
- 2013 per the CAMPO plan, the Mobility Authority and TxDOT launch MoPac South Environmental Study

MoPac South Purpose and Need

Purpose – What are we trying to do?

- Provide an opportunity for reliable travel times
- Improve operational efficiency
- Create a dependable and consistent route for transit
- Facilitate reliable emergency response

Need – What problems are we trying to address?

- Current and forecasted congestion levels are creating unreliable travel times
- Forecasted population, traffic and employment growth, resulting in increased congestion and delay
- Emergency response times are impacted by traffic congestion

MoPac South Evaluation Criteria

Evaluation Criteria for Alternatives

- Improvements to operational efficiency
 - Travel times for General Purpose and Express Lane users
 - Consistent with CAMPO Regional Transportation Plan
 - Access and affordability
- Potential impacts to the natural and human environment
 - Visual and noise impacts
 - Park land impact
 - Shared use paths and sidewalks



- Development of Criteria developed by project team and reviewed by the leading agencies, and TWG under oversight by TxDOT
- Identify and Advance Alternative Concepts based upon Criteria that evaluate potential environmental impacts, cultural impacts and addresses purpose and need
- Mobility Authority facilitates evaluation and community input ensures that the NEPA process is followed
- TxDOT Environmental Division with authority from FHWA reviews and approves the Environmental Assessment

Public Meeting Comments to Date



November 7, 2013: Open House 1

- Comment period from October 8 through November 18
- 70 public comments received, both comments and responses are available on the project website, MoPacSouth.com

- April 29, 2014: Open House 2

- Comment period March 30 through May 9
- 64 public comments received, both comments and responses are available on the project website, MoPacSouth.com

• February 26, 2015: Open House 3

- Comment period January 29 through March 9
- 253 public comments received, both comments and responses are available on the project website, MoPacSouth.com

• November 10, 2015: Open House 4

- Comment period October 21 through November 20
- More than 1,500 comments received and were made available online on the project website.
 Responses will be posted online pending resolution of lawsuit and TxDOT review.

- Addition of new collector-distributor at Loop 360 City of Austin
- Direct connector landing shifted farther east on Cesar Chavez Street Austin ISD
