PRIMACY

• Board Declared Primacy September 28, 2016

TxDOT REQUEST

- MA to Develop/Construct East 290 to South 130 (ESDC)
- TxDOT to Reimburse Mobility Authority for ESDC
- TxDOT will operate ESDC as part of Central Texas Turnpike System
- TxDOT assumes ESDC Final Maintenance

ACTION

- Would require Board To Rescind Primacy on ESDC
- Contingent on TxDOT Funding Commitment



Scope of Work and Schedule




- Work includes elements related to the MoPac Improvement Project


Project Delivery Method Comparison



Activity	Design-Bid-Build	Design-Build
Contracts	Two contracts (Engineer and Contractor)	One contract (Developer includes design and construction)
Engineer Selection	Through Request For Qualifications/Request for Proposals process	Included in developer team, not directly selected
Contractor Selection	Low bid	 Shortlist of qualified bidders Selection process includes both technical and price
Design	Mobility Authority performs design	Developer performs design
Utility Adjustments	Mobility Authority Responsibility	Developer Responsibility
Sequence of Work	Linear: construction follows completed design and utility relocations	Packaging of design work to allow for early construction

Project Delivery Method Advantages



Design-Bid-Build

- Mobility Authority retains full control of designer selection
- Mobility Authority retains full control of design
- Mobility Authority manages pre-construction schedule
- Bidders have clearly defined scope
- Bidders' risk profile is lower and may result in more competitive pricing
- Both design team and contractor are accountable to the Mobility Authority

Design-Build

- Earlier to bond market can take advantage of favorable interest rates
- Design and Utility Relocation costs are included in financing
- Proposers shortlisted based on qualifications
- Best value selection includes technical proposal and price proposal
- Encourages innovative design
- Single point of liability for design and construction
- Overlap phasing of design and construction can allow construction to begin sooner



- Vetting of proposed contractor team

Earlier to bond market


- Opportunities for industry feedback during procurement

- Fastest project delivery method to allow for earlier toll collection



Express Lane Performance





 - traffic shift and begin paving








Friction Course Paving

















Retaining Wall






Traffic Barrier






