Total System Transactions









Project Description & Background



Project Description

- The Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority is proposing to extend the existing 11.6 mile 183A Toll Road north from Hero Way to SH 29.
- The 5.3 mile proposed roadway will have up to three tolled lanes in each direction.
- The proposed highway will be located within the existing TxDOT right-of-way within the median of the existing US 183 corridor.

Background

- Phase I (opened March 2007) 11.6 miles of the tolled facility from RM 260 to New Hope Drive and 7.5 miles of non-tolled frontage roads from RM 1431 to the South Fork San Gabriel River
- Phase II (opened April 2012) Extended tolled mainlanes approximately 5 miles north from RM 1431 to Hero Way

 - Unprecedented growth in region

Facilitate congestion management to meet the needs of community growth and travel demand









Express Lane Performance Data









Cash Flow Diagram










Major Construction Impacts



In advance of lane reductions impacting traffic at Loyola Lane and US 183, a robust community outreach effort was undertaken:






Status of Public Inquiries

- There were no complaints received regarding the Loyola Lane reductions







...But express commuter coaches move 26% of the commuters travelling through the Lane!



183 North Project Description

- Two express lanes in each direction with direct connectors to/from MoPac (31 lane miles)
- Fourth general purpose lane where only three exist (8.5 lane miles)
- New shared use-paths, new sidewalks and cross-street connections for bicycles/pedestrians
- Approximately 13-miles in length, including all transitions
- PROJECT PURPOSE
 - Facilitate congestion management in the corridor
 - Provide a reliable route for transit
 - Facilitate reliable emergency response
- Total Cost:
 - CTRMA \$380M
 - TxDOT \$120M

Roles and Responsibilities

Mobility Authority

- Costs for tolled elements
- Assist in development of procurement, design, and construction documents
- Participate in the evaluation process and selection of the Apparent Best Value Proposer
- Operations and maintenance of tolled elements

TxDOT

- Costs for the non-tolled elements
- Lead the development of procurement, design, and construction documents
- Lead evaluation process and selection of the Apparent Best Value Proposal
- Operation and maintenance of non-tolled elements

Project Procurement



- TxDOT will use a two-phase procurement process including:
 - Request for qualifications (RFQ)
 - Request for proposals (RFP)
- Proposers are shortlisted in the first phase based on written and oral responses to the following evaluation categories:
 - Qualifications and Experience
 - Statement of Technical Approach
 - Safety
- Shortlisted Proposers submit proposals in response to an RFP in the second phase of the procurement
- Proposals will be evaluated and an Apparent Best Value Proposer selected based on:
 - Price proposal (70% of the maximum score)
 - Technical proposal (30% of the maximum score)

Project Construction




- The Project will be delivered by TxDOT using the design-build delivery method
- TxDOT currently anticipates executing the design-build contract in summer/fall 2018
- The Mobility Authority will observe and participate in TxDOT's management of the design, construction, inspection, and testing oversight
- Upon Project completion:
 - The design-build contract will include performance warranties for up to five (5) years
 - The Mobility Authority will own the managed lanes and have exclusive right to establish the toll rate and collect tolls

A Project Development Agreement (PDA) will be executed by both parties identifying the respective roles and responsibilities

Project Development Agreement (PDA)



- This Project Development Agreement outlines the roles and responsibilities for CTRMA and TxDOT through the procurement, design, and construction of the project and provides the following detail:
 - TxDOT intends to develop and construct the tolled and non-tolled elements and finance, operate, and maintain the non-tolled elements.
 - CTRMA intents to review and assist in development of procurement, design, and construction documents, and finance, operate, and maintain the tolled elements.
- Once the PDA is approved the RFQ will be issued by TxDOT


