## Scope of Services

- We have been engaged by CTRMA to
  - Express an opinion regarding the presentation of management's financial statements prepared in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles
  - Perform the compliance audits of Federal and State Awards and issue reports on internal controls over financial reporting and tests of compliance for major programs for each of these audits



### **Audit Overview**

- Financial Statement Audit Scope
  - CTRMA Financial Statements are prepared by management
  - Our audit includes
    - Examining evidence supporting amounts and disclosures on a test basis
    - An assessment of internal control structure for purposes of auditing the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, but not for providing an opinion on internal control
    - An assessment of accounting principles, significant estimates made by management, and disclosures to the financial statements



### Audit Overview - continued

- Federal and State Awards Audit Scope
  - State Compliance Audit (required if \$750,000 or more in expenditures)
  - Federal Compliance Audit (required if \$750,000 or more in expenditures)
  - Each of these audits will result in our
    - Auditor's report on compliance with regulations for each major program
    - Auditor's report on internal control over compliance with laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements, and other matters for each major program



## Responsibilities of the Audit Committee

- Committee's Responsibilities
  - Oversight of financial reporting process
  - Setting an appropriate organizational "tone at the top" for creating a culture of high ethical standards surrounding financial reporting and compliance
  - Communication to auditors of audit questions or concerns
  - Communication to auditors of suspected fraud
  - Communication to auditors of concerns about management integrity
  - Communication to auditors of unusual transactions or large transactions with related parties



## Responsibilities of Management

## Management's Responsibilities

- Preparing and fairly presenting the financial statements and schedule of expenditures of awards in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles
- Establishing and maintaining effective internal controls
- Adopting and following industry standard accounting policies
- Identifying and confirming that CTRMA complies with laws and regulations related to its activities
- Identification and communication of suspected fraud
- Identification and evaluation of subsequent events
- Identification and communication of unusual transactions or large transactions with related parties



## Responsibilities of the Audit Firm

## Auditor's Responsibilities

- Conduct the audit in conformity with U.S. Generally Accepted Auditing Standards
- Conduct the audit in conformity with Government Auditing Standards
- Perform audit procedures to obtain evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies
- Evaluate the reasonableness of significant estimates
- Consider internal control relevant to financial statement preparation but not for the purpose of reporting on the internal controls

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



- Emphasize HUBs and local firms








## Winsted / Enfield Travel Time Changes







### **MoPac Toll Waiver Decision Tree**



Incident in Express Lane

- Vehicles able to pass? Hold toll rate until incident clears.
- Vehicles unable to pass? Post "CLOSED" on Express Lane rate signs and adjust toll rates to \$0.00.

Incident in Regular Lanes

 Hold Express Lane toll rate until hourly traffic volume exceeds 1,700

Regular Lanes
Closed

- Post "FREE" on Express Lane rate signs
- Adjust toll rates to \$0.00



#### **MoPac Fun Facts**



- There are 8,648 plastic delineators separating the Express Lane from the regular lanes
- A night crew does debris and delineator maintenance as needed, Monday Friday from 5 pm 2 am
- Since October 2017 we have replaced approximately 47 delineators each month
- If you stacked the delineators on top of each other, they would reach 19,245 feet in the air – the cruising altitude of a light airplane

## **Aesthetics Outreach**



The pre-construction Context Sensitive Solutions process identified three community priorities for the corridor aesthetics:

**Enhanced landscaping Community Connections Regional Identity**











#### **Cash Flow Without Mobilization**



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#### **CTRMA Veteran Discount Program**

Texas House Bill 3139, made effective on September 1, 2009:

- Allows a toll entity to establish discount program for electronic toll collection customers for certain veteran classes.
- States that the Program must include free or discounted use of the entity's toll project by an electronic toll collection customer whose account relates to a qualified veteran.
- Authorizes legislature to appropriate funds from the general revenue fund to a toll project entity to defray the cost.


#### **Operational Considerations**

- Electronic Toll Collection and Interoperability
  - Different rules for various electronic toll tag products leads to confusion
- Pay By Mail / Infrequent Toll Users
  - Additional cost incurred for image-based transactions
- Express Lane Facilities
  - Every vehicle in the Express Lane affects the price
- Program Limits
  - No limitation on number of vehicles one can register under veteran plate codes
- Revenue Impact
  - Veteran discounts adds to revenue loss from first responder and transit exemptions



#### **Next Steps**

- ✓ Conduct traffic and revenue study
- Investigate the legal, operational and customer service impacts
- Coordinate with other Texas agencies
- Develop program guidelines
- Seek Board input and consideration

#### April 25, 2018 until May 30, 2018 Board Meeting:


- Finance and all departments will be available to meet on an as needed basis.
- Revenues will be refined as our analysis of each roadway's revenues become more complete.
- The Operations department's expenditures will be broken out by roadway.
- Departmental Narratives and the Overview will be added at the beginning of each section.
- Details of changes and feedback from the Board since the April 25, 2018 meeting will be presented to Board at the May 30<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.

#### May 30, 2018 until June 27, 2018 Board Meeting:

- Finance and all departments will be available to meet on an as needed basis.
- Any further refinements identified by staff will be incorporated and documented and shared in advance with the Board.
- Board or Executive Director changes will be made.

#### June 27, 2018 Board Meeting:

- Details of changes since the May 30, 2018 meeting will be presented to Board at the June 27<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.
- At the June 27<sup>th</sup> Board meeting, amendments to the budget can still be made.
- Appropriate action to adopt FY 2019 Budget will be requested for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018.
