Veteran Discount Legislation

Texas House Bill 3139, made effective on September 1, 2009:

- State that a toll entity may establish discount program for electronic toll collection customers for certain veteran classes (disabled veterans and Legion on Valor and Medal of Honor recipients).
- States that the Program must include free or discounted use of the entity's toll project by an electronic toll collection customer whose account relates to a qualified veteran.
- Authorizes legislature to appropriate funds from the general revenue fund to a toll project entity to defray the cost.

RESOLUTION NO. 10-106

Authorizing a Program for Free or Discounted Use of CTRMA Toll Projects by Certain Eligible Vehicles Subject to Funding by the State of Texas to Defray the Cost of the Program

WHEREAS, in 2009, the 81st Texas Legislature passed and the Governor signed H.B. 3139, which took effect on September 1, 2009; and

WHEREAS, Section 372.053 of the Transportation Code, enacted by H.B. 3139, authorizes a toll project entity such as the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority to establish a program for free or discounted use of a toll project for a vehicle registered under Transportation Code § 504.202 [disabled veterans], § 504.315(g) ["recipients of the Purple Heart"], or to "a person who has received the Medal of Honor;" and

WHEREAS, in subsection (b) of Section 372.053, the Legislature provided that "[t]he legislature may appropriate funds from the general revenue fund to a toll project entity to defray the cost of providing free or discounted use of the entity's toll project ..."; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors supports the idea of establishing a program to provide free or discounted use of CTRMA's toll projects to vehicles eligible under Section 372.053, provided that the State of Texas, rather than the other users of CTRMA toll projects, defrays the cost of that program.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors authorizes the Executive Director to begin designing a program to provide free or discounted use of CTRMA toll projects

- CTRMA Board adopted a resolution expressing its support of Texas House Bill 3139 in December 2010.
- Authorized the Executive Director to design a program that offered veteran discounts.
- Directed the Executive Director to bring the program to the Board for approval once the State appropriated and made available sufficient funds to defray full cost of the program.



Veteran Discount Program Recommendation

- Participation is limited to one (1) vehicle per household.
- Vehicle must be associated to a qualified license plate and electronic toll tag account.
- Discount only applies to 183A, 290, 71 and 45 SW toll facilities;
 MoPac Express Lanes are excluded from the program.
- Unpaid tolls must be fully resolved prior to acceptance into the discount program.
- Participants must use CTRMA's online portal to register.
- Participants must notify CTRMA of any change to their license plate or tag number. Failure to do so may result in charges to the associated toll tag account.



The Board Members and staff of the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority honor and appreciate the service of the men and woman of our military forces, past and present. State law allows a Texas toll road entity to offer discounted or free tolls to Congressional Medal of Honor, Legion of Valor and Purple Heart recipients as well as disabled veterans who qualify and meet the requirements for specialty license plates. Effective (TBD), the Mobility Authority will offer discounted tolls to these valued service members.

To participate, the vehicle must display the required license plate and be associated with an electronic toll tag account. Program participation is limited to one (1) vehicle per household. Customers must use CTRMA's online portal to register. You may also email veterans@ctrma.org or call (512) 450-XXXX to register.

The CTRMA veteran discount program only applies to open road tolling facilities operated by the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority - 183A Toll, 290 Toll, 71 Toll and 45 SW Toll. Express lane facilities (e.g., the MoPac Express Lanes) are excluded from the program.

Tolls incurred before the program's implementation must be fully resolved prior to entry into the discount program.

It is the customer's responsibility to notify CTRMA of any changes to their license plate or tag number. Failure to do so may result in charges to your toll tag account.

Next Steps

Upon Board direction to implement:

- Summer 2018: Develop reports, design and implement customer registration portal / website changes and communication plan
- Sept / Oct 2018: Seek board action to amend CTRMA's Toll Policy to include this category of vehicle exemption
- November 2018: Implement program





Video Tolling in Texas



- Customers who do not have an electronic toll tag receive a bill through the mail based on their license plate
 - Dallas ZipCash
 - Austin / Tyler / Brownsville Pay By Mail
 - Houston no video toll option
- Pay By Mail toll rates are higher to offset the cost of processing license plate information
- Pay By Mail is a courtesy program in which administrative fees are added for non-payment



Pay By Mail Administrative Fees

- New Pay Mail Program to Go Live in November 2018
- Board to Consider and Adopt a Fee Structure Prior to Go Live
- Pay By Mail Fee Analysis Underway
 - Customer Convenience
 - Minimize Revenue Leakage
 - Potential Changes in Legislation
 - Regional Consistency



Senate Bill 312

- Texas Transportation Commission adopted a rule setting TxDOT's late fee at \$4 per statement per month.
- The department may not charge a customer more than \$48 in late fees in a 12-month period.
- Changes are effective for tolls incurred on or after March 1, 2018.
- Texas Attorney General's office confirmed that Senate Bill 312 only applies when a toll entity is operating a TxDOT-owned toll project pursuant to a contract or agreement.




Senate Bill 312 Analysis

- The SB 312 admin fee cap would result in a \$3M decrease in the Mobility Authority's share of the Pay By Mail fee revenue.
- To remain revenue neutral, CTRMA would need to increase the Pay By Mail differential from its current 33% to 90%.
 - This change would affect <u>both</u> paying and non-paying customers.




Next Steps


- June 2018: Complete fee and toll rate analysis to determine revenue impact

- October 2018: Board action to amend CTRMA's Toll Policy
- November 2018: Implement new Pay By Mail program





183A Reduced Tolling Options




























Project Status

Project Description


- Construct 4 tolled lanes from Hero Way to SH 29 (6-miles)


- Board approved procurement of Design Firm for final design (Nov 8, 2017)

- Continue environmental and schematic documents









