Amend Mobility Authority Policy Code Chapter 3, Article 1, Subchapter A, Toll Rates & B, Toll Collections to change the escalation methodology for the minimum toll rate on the **MoPac Express Lanes;** implement the **Qualified Veterans Discount Program, the** Habitual Violator Policy and the new Pay By Mail Program adopted by the Board; update provisions related to tag transponder usage to address interoperability; and, prohibit vehicles weighing more than one ton from using the tolled express lanes



- Item seeks to make various changes to the Mobility Authority's Policy Code to:
 - codify recent Board actions;
 - clarify language where needed; and
 - update to reflect certain operational elements.



Section 301.2, Toll Rates

"The minimum toll rate per segment will be adjusted annually in accordance with the methodology set for toll rate escalation in Section 301.003."

- Amended to adjust the minimum toll annually by \$0.05 per segment until the minimum toll rate per segment is \$0.50, at which point the annual adjustment will follow policy.
 - Adjusts for inflation and allows for gradual increase to expected minimum toll for other managed lane projects



Section 301.4, Exemption from Toll

"(a) An authorized emergency vehicle defined by Section 541.201; (b) a state or federal military vehicle under Section 362.901; and (c) transit program vehicles established and managed by CapMetro and CARTS are exempt from paying a toll to use an authority toll facility."

- Amended to add new exemption for qualified veterans discount program participants
 - Codifies Board approval of qualified veteran discount program



Section 301.5, Discounts and Incentives

- "Transponder programs that are interoperable with the authority's facilities include TxDOT's TxTag, HCTRA's EZ Tag and NTTA's Toll Tag."
- Amended to indicate that accepted interoperable transponders are listed on the Authority's website
 - Alleviates the need for future policy code amendments as additional transponder products become interoperable



Section 301.7, Transponder Accounts

"A transponder that is interoperable with the authority's toll facilities is for use with one vehicle per transponder, and should not be transferred to another vehicle..."

- Amended to recognize that transponders are an accepted form of payment and subject to their own user agreements.
 - Alleviates the need for future policy code amendments as additional tag products become interoperable.



Section 301.8, Unauthorized Use of Transponder

"A transponder that is interoperable with the authority's toll facilities is for use with one vehicle per transponder, and should not be transferred to another vehicle..."

 Deleted section as the authorized use of each interoperable transponder is regulated and enforced by the transponder issuers.



Section 301.9, Video Billing

"The Collections Contractor will send an invoice to the registered owner of the vehicle and accept payment on behalf of the authority. The Collections Contractor will add a \$1.00 handling fee for each invoice. The Collections Contractor will retain the additional toll surcharge and handling fee to cover their cost and forward the toll payments to the authority. All toll bills/invoices require payment within 30 days of the date thereof."

- Amended to be consistent with the new Pay By Mail program.
 - Alleviates the need for future policy code amendments as fee or process changes are approved



- Section 301.10, Establishment of Administrative Fees for Unpaid Tolls
 - Amended to be consistent with the new Pay By Mail program approved by the Board.
 - Alleviates the need for future policy code amendments as fee or process changes are approved



Section 301.11, Customer Service and Violation Policies

- Amended to add "Enforcement" to section title
- Amended to include additional administrative fees and collection activities as non-payment penalties
- Amended to include habitual violator enforcement remedies, clarify the Board's role in prohibiting vehicles and explain the customer's right to appeal a habitual violator determination.
 - Alleviates the need for future policy code amendments as fee or process changes are approved



Section 301. 21, Vehicles Prohibited in an Express Lane

- "No person shall operate a vehicle with (a) more than two axles or (b) towing a trailer on an authority facility designated as a tolled express lane that has variable rate tolls."
- Amended to add that vehicles weighing more than one ton are not allowed to operate on tolled express lanes.





Cashflow Analysis


















- Truss Bridge Freeboard
 - 19' above 100-year event
- New Bridge Scour Analysis
 - Based on 500-year event

Major Floods Since 1951

- 1952 Lake Travis rose 57' in 14 hours
- 1981 10-inch rain in 4 hours downstream of Mansfield Dam
- 1991 Christmas Flood, All-Time High Elevation (4' shy of Mansfield spillway)
- 2007 June, 19-inch "rain bomb" in Marble Falls
- 2018 October, Lake Travis 5th highest elevation since construction of Mansfield Dam

 - Irrigation system will greatly increase trees' chances of survival






















13 Qualified Veterans Discount Program Update



Program Overview



- Program becomes effective on Nov 1st.
- Qualifying Texas license plates are disabled veterans and recipients of the Purple Heart, Legion of Valor, and Medal of Honor awards.
- Participants receive toll-free passage on all Mobility Authority-operated roads, <u>except</u> <u>MoPac Express Lanes</u>.
- Participation is limited to one (1) qualifying vehicle per veteran.



Program Eligibility

Vehicle must be compliant with the following at the time of the transaction:

- Registered with the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles;
- Issued a qualifying specialty plate and have it properly displayed;
- Associated to an electronic toll tag account; and
- Have no outstanding Mobility Authority toll violations.




Process Overview

- 1. Veteran completes registration form.
- 2. Mobility Authority confirms eligibility.
- 3. License plate and tag number are added to exempt database.
- 4. Email sent to veteran confirming program participation and effective date of exemption.

- Sent letters to 25,446 veterans informing them about the program.
- Extended settlement offers to 16,000 veterans with toll balances.
