

Pedestrian Bridge History



- Pedestrian bridge constructed in 1991 following 1987 death of LBJ High School student Lisa Simone Jones
 - City of Austin adopted resolution requesting TxDOT designate the bridge as the "Lisa Simone Jones Memorial Overpass"
 - June 20, 1992: Community dedication event held at pedestrian bridge
- Over the years, pedestrian deaths continued to be an issue in the area around the pedestrian bridge



Focus on Pedestrian Safety




- Mobility Authority committed to improving safety and minimizing pedestrian deaths on new 183 South
 - Original pedestrian bridge replaced as part of 183 South project
 - Aesthetic pedestrian fencing added to encourage bridge use
 - Family of Lisa Jones requested old memorial plaque be installed on new bridge



 Honor Lisa Jones with a resolution in support of mounting her memorial plaque on the new Purple Sage Pedestrian Bridge









- 183 North project limits: North of SH
 45 to east and south of Mopac
- Staff recommends that the Board add the 183 North Project to the system





183 North Mobility Project




- Project Limits: SH 45 to State Loop 1 (MoPAC)
- Project Length: 9 miles
- Total Project Cost: \$500 Million
- Project Status: Design-Build Procurement



183 North Mobility Project Scope





- Mobility Authority improvements within TxDOT ROW create joint facility
- Two express lanes in each direction and widening to four non-tolled lanes in each direction
- Improvements on MoPac including a flyover ramp linking the MoPac Express Lanes to the 183 North Express Lanes
- Bicycle and pedestrian improvements

Purpose of Project Development Agreement (PDA)



- Recognizes that improvements are within TxDOT's state highway system
- Establishes respective commercial obligations of the Mobility Authority and TxDOT
- Covers key phases of procurement, design, and construction delivery
- Describes the relationship between TxDOT's and Mobility Authority's future roadway assets
- Encapsulates relative funding arrangements and reimbursement terms
- Establishes administration, communications, and reporting protocols




Project Limits: FM 1626 to State Loop 1 (MoPac)

Project Length: 3.6 miles

Total Project Cost: \$109 Million

Change Order #023 – Differing Site Conditions





Rock crushing and material sorting operations on 45SW

Differing Site Conditions

- Substantially and materially different site conditions
- Contract documents indicated solid rock
- Actual conditions were loose rock, up to 8' diameter boulders
- Contract requirements stipulated material must remain on-site
- Unplanned rock crushing operation required to process boulders
- Environmental limitations lead to excessive trucking within the site

Change Order #023 – Differing Site Conditions



Project Impacts

- Adds \$1,570,580.74 to McCarthy contract
- No time extension associated with this change

Background



- Fagan Consulting LLC has served as the Mobility Authority's general system consultant since 2014
- Fagan Consulting provides a wide range of services to the Mobility Authority in the areas of toll systems expertise, strategic guidance and operational recommendations
- In July 2019 the Board approved a one year contract extension to allow for continuation of key revenueimpacting initiatives at a total cost not to exceed \$1,318,626 – the amount specified for General Systems Consultants services in the approved FY 2020 budget



Program Overview



- Implemented November 1st, 2018
- Qualifying Texas license plates are Disabled Veteran, Purple Heart, Congressional Medal of Honor and Legion of Valor
- Participants receive toll-free passage on all Mobility Authority operated roads, except MoPac Express Lanes
- Participation is limited to one (1) qualifying vehicle per veteran




Mobility Authority confirms eligibility License plate and tag are added to exempt database

Notification sent to customer confirming program enrollment


Veteran Program Registered Vehicles (Cumulative)






Veteran Program Transactions By Roadway
