Sec. 370.262. MEETINGS BY TELEPHONE CONFERENCE CALL.

- (a) Chapter 551, Government Code, does not prohibit any open or closed meeting of the board, a committee of the board, or the staff, or any combination of the board or staff, from being held by telephone conference call. The board may hold an open or closed meeting by telephone conference call subject to the requirements of Sections 551.125(c)-(f), Government Code, but is not subject to the requirements of Subsection (b) of that section.
- (b) A telephone conference call meeting is subject to the notice requirements applicable to other meetings.
- (c) Notice of a telephone conference call meeting that by law must be open to the public must specify the location of the meeting. The location must be a conference room of the authority or other facility in a county of the authority that is accessible to the public.
- (d) Each part of the telephone conference call meeting that by law must be open to the public shall be audible to the public at the location specified in the notice and shall be tape-recorded or documented by written minutes. On conclusion of the meeting, the tape recording or the written minutes of the meeting shall be made available to the public.

Sec. 551.125. OTHER GOVERNMENTAL BODY. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this subchapter, this chapter does not prohibit a governmental body from holding an open or closed meeting by telephone conference call.

- (b) A meeting held by telephone conference call may be held only if:
- (1) an emergency or public necessity exists within the meaning of Section 551.045 of this chapter; and
- (2) the convening at one location of a quorum of the governmental body is difficult or impossible; or
- (3) the meeting is held by an advisory board.
- (c) The telephone conference call meeting is subject to the notice requirements applicable to other meetings.
- (d) The notice of the telephone conference call meeting must specify as the location of the meeting the location where meetings of the governmental body are usually held.
- (e) Each part of the telephone conference call meeting that is required to be open to the public shall be audible to the public at the location specified in the notice of the meeting as the location of the meeting and shall be tape-recorded. The tape recording shall be made available to the public.
- (f) The location designated in the notice as the location of the meeting shall provide two-way communication during the entire telephone conference call meeting and the identification of each party to the telephone conference shall be clearly stated prior to speaking.

<u>Project Description/Background</u> - The Purple Sage Pedestrian Bridge across US 183 near the intersection of Manor Road and Springdale Road was originally constructed in 1992 to facilitate safe pedestrian crossing access following the tragic death of an LBJ High School student, Lisa Simone Jones. The LBJ High School community rallied together in support of the late student and her family and placed a memorial plaque on the bridge to honor her memory.

As part of the 183 South Project, the Purple Sage Pedestrian Bridge was demolished and reconstructed. The Mobility Authority's 183 South Project Team salvaged the dedication plaque from the original bridge prior to demolition. (See exhibit B, photo of plaque). The east Austin community and the family of Lisa Jones have requested that the Mobility Authority install the memorial plaque on the newly constructed bridge.

<u>Previous Actions/Brief History of the Project/Program</u> – Research indicates that the City of Austin adopted a resolution on March 12, 1992, requesting that TxDOT officially designate the Purple Sage Pedestrian Bridge as the "Lisa Simone Jones Memorial Overpass". Through public engagement efforts on the 183 South Project, the Mobility Authority learned that the east Austin community and LBJ High School officials held an

unofficial dedication ceremony when the plaque was installed in 1992. Various neighborhood groups and community organizations are aware of the plaque and the young lady whose life it recognizes and have expressed their desire to see that designation live on with the new bridge. The Mobility Authority would like to preserve the memory of this young lady by installing the plaque on the new bridge.

<u>Project Description/Background</u> - The 183 South Project is adding three tolled lanes in each direction on an 8-mile stretch of US 183 between US 290 and SH 71. When the project is complete, it will offer drivers a non-stop, signal free route to get to their destination without delay. This key north-south alternative to I-35 will provide significant improvements to the corridor including enhanced non-tolled general-purpose lanes, and an extensive network of bicycle and pedestrian accommodations.

<u>Previous Actions/Brief History of the Project/Program</u> – As part of the 183 South Project, the Mobility Authority entered into an interlocal agreement (ILA) with the City of Austin for the adjustments of water and wastewater lines in connection with the Project. This item considers amendment No. 2 to the ILA providing additional funding from the City of Austin for additional betterments. By Resolution No. 16-018, dated March 30, 2016, the Board of Directors authorized the Executive Director to execute an ILA with the City of Austin, identifying roles and responsibilities of the parties involved, including payment obligations for utility betterments requested by the City of Austin authorizing \$7,728,157 in betterments.

By Resolution No. 17-049, dated September 6, 2017, the Board of Directors authorized the Executive Director to negotiate and execute an amendment to the Interlocal Agreement with the City of Austin to incorporate and provide funding for the City of Austin's requested wastewater betterments at Little Walnut Creek authorizing \$1,009,999.64 in betterments.

<u>Action requested/Staff Recommendation -</u> The City is requesting that additional betterments be installed by the Mobility Authority including upgrades and new infrastructure. This amendment No. 2 to the ILA includes increases the lump sum payment to the Mobility Authority by \$206,168. Staff recommends approval of this item, proposed amendment No. 2 to the interlocal agreement with the City of Austin, which will provide \$206,168 for additional City of Austin betterments.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 15-049, dated July 29, 2015, the Board of Directors authorized the Executive Director to execute a design-build contract with Colorado River Constructors for design and construction of the Bergstrom (183 South) Expressway Project ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the design-build contract, Colorado River Constructors is bound to adjust and relocate utilities that are within the jurisdiction of the City of Austin, including betterments as requested by the City of Austin; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 16-018, dated March 30, 2016, the Board of Directors authorized the Executive Director to execute an Interlocal agreement with the City of Austin, identifying roles and responsibilities of the parties involved, including payment obligations for utility betterments requested by the City of Austin; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 17-049, dated September 6, 2017, the Board of Directors authorized and directed the Executive Director to negotiate and execute Amendment No. 1 to the Interlocal Agreement with the City of Austin to incorporate and provide funding for the City of Austin's requested wastewater betterments and Little Walnut Creek; and

WHEREAS, the City of Austin has requested additional betterments, including upgrades and new infrastructure not included in the Interlocal Agreement or Amendment No. 1; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director and the City of Austin have negotiated Amendment No. 2 to the Interlocal Agreement to include an additional lump sum payment from the City of Austin in the amount of \$206,167.22 for the additional betterments to be installed by the Mobility Authority, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director recommends approval of proposed Amendment No. 2 to the Interlocal Agreement with the City of Austin in the form or substantially the same form as is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors hereby approves Amendment No. 2 to the Interlocal Agreement with the City of Austin for utility betterments on the Bergstrom (183 South) Expressway Project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Executive Director is hereby authorized to	finalize and

SECOND AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR THE ADJUSTMENTS OF CITY OF AUSTIN WATER AND WASTEWATER SYSTEM UTILITY IN CONNECTION WITH THE BERGSTROM EXPRESSWAY (183) PROJECT

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT (the "Second Amendment") is made and entered into by and between the City of Austin, a Texas home-rule city (the "City") and the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority (the "Mobility Authority" and together with the City the "Parties")

I. RECITALS:

- 1. WHEREAS, on December 17,2015, the City Council for the City of Austin (the "Council") authorized the negotiation and execution of an interlocal agreement with the Mobility Authority for the relocation and improvement of water and wastewater utilities related to the Mobility Authority's Bergstrom Expressway (183 South) project (the "Relocation and Improvements") for the amount of \$6,717,549 plus a contingency amount of \$1,010,608, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$7,728,157.
- 2. WHEREAS, on July 1, 2016, the Parties executed an interlocal agreement (the "Interlocal Agreement") that set forth agreed terms for the design and construction of the Relocation and Improvements.
- 3. WHEREAS, on September 7, 2017, the Parties executed a first amendment to the Interlocal Agreement (the "First Amendment") related to additional betterments requested by the City to include an additional lump sum payment to the Mobility Authority of \$1,009,999.64, an amount authorized by the Council's November 19, 2015, action authorizing the negotiation and execution the Interlocal Agreement.
- 4. WHEREAS, on November 9, 2017, the Council authorized the negotiation and execution of a second amendment to the Interlocal Agreement to increase the project amount by \$650,031.78 and add an additional contingency amount of \$537,806.22 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$8,915,995.
- 5. WHEREAS, the City is requesting that additional betterments be installed by the Mobility Authority including upgrades and new infrastructure (the "Additional Betterments").
- 6. WHEREAS, the City and the Mobility Authority now desire to enter into this Second Amendment to include the Additional Betterments and increase the lump sum payment to the Mobility Authority by \$206,168.
- 7. WHEREAS, payment for the Additional Betterments is authorized by the Council's November 9, 2017, action related to the authorization and negotiation of a second amendment to the Interlocal Agreement.
- 8. NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing premises and the mutual agreements and covenants set forth below, the Parties hereby amend the Interlocal Agreement as follows:

II. AMENDMENTS

- 1. From and after the Effective Date of this Second Amendment, all references in the 183 South project to the "Interlocal Agreement" shall mean and refer to the Interlocal Agreement for the Adjustments of City of Austin Water and Wastewater System Utilities in Connection with the Bergstrom Expressway (183 South) Project as amended by the First Amendment and this Second Amendment.
- 2. Exhibit "A" to the Interlocal Agreement entitled Funding and Contributions is hereby amended by the new Exhibit "A1" entitled "Amended Funding and Contributions" in the form attached to this Second Amendment. From and after the Effective Date of this Second Amendment, all references in the Interlocal Agreement to Exhibit A shall mean and refer to Exhibit A as amended by Exhibit A1.
- 3. A new Exhibit "E1" entitled List of Additional Betterments, in the form attached to this Second Amendment, is hereby added as an additional exhibit to the Interlocal Agreement.

III. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. The terms and conditions of the Interlocal Agreement are incorporated by reference for all purposes. Except as specifically amended and modified by the First Amendment and this Second Amendment, the parties hereby agree that the terms and conditions of the Interlocal Agreement remain in full force and effect as written.
 - 2. This Second Amendment may be executed in duplicate originals, each of equal dignity.
- 3. This Second Amendment becomes effective from and after the date when it is signed by the last party whose signing makes this Second Amendment fully executed (the "Effective Date").

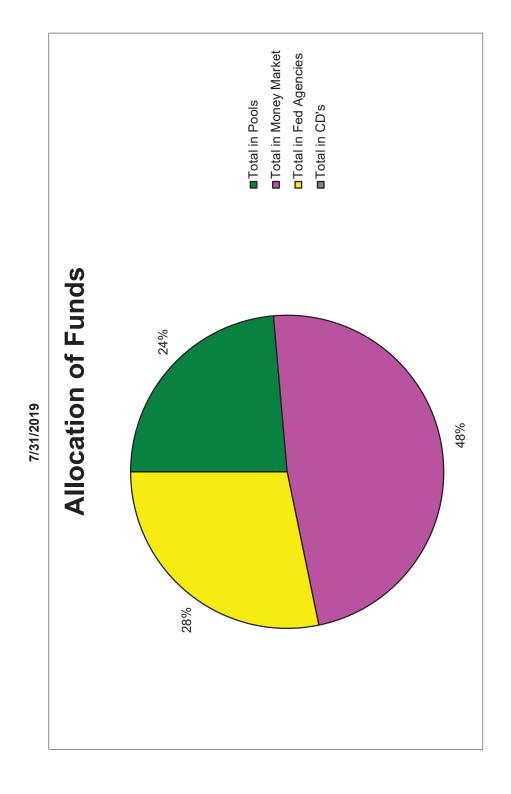

Economic Commentary

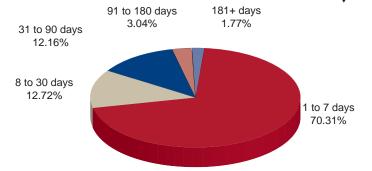
Uncertainty regarding U.S. and China trade negotiations and expectations for a Federal Reserve rate cut at the end of the month were the major forces that drove markets. Early in the month, President Trump and President Xi of China agreed to a truce as the latest survey of businesses suggested growth momentum continued to slide. The weakness in global manufacturing continued unabated and the subdued inflation and softening inflation expectations prompted expectations of "insurance cuts" from the Fed. At its July 31 meeting, the Fed eased for the first time since December 2008 on the back of slowing business investment, a weak US manufacturing sector and downside risks related to depressed global growth and muted inflation. This was in contrast to still robust conditions in the labor market and strong consumption spending in the US. The 3-month Treasury bill yield declined 3 basis points (bps) to end the month at 2.06%. Then, on August 1st, the US-China trade war was escalated as President Trump lamented the outcome of a round of negotiations between top US and Chinese officials. In a series of tweets that sent the markets reeling, he said the US would place a 10% tariff on \$300bn of additional Chinese goods starting September 1st.

The domestic drivers of U.S. growth continue to remain intact and consumption will continue to be the bedrock of growth in the second half of 2019. The main factors driving the consumer include rising incomes, an elevated savings rates and strong employment growth and rising participation for price age workers. With the labor market still tight and layoffs still low, we would expect gradual wage growth to continue and job growth to slow as the year progresses. The trend pace of core CPI should remain supported around 2.0 - 2.25% as long as the labor market continues maintain its strength. At this point in time, the impacts of the trade war are expected to slow growth closer to trend, depress business investment and slow the manufacturing activity but have not yet meaningfully impacted labor markets or the service sector which has remained resilient. We expect the Fed to cut policy rates two additional times in 2019 in order to address the downside risks to US growth, rising trade tensions and a slowing U.S. manufacturing sector with risks to business investment. The case for the Fed to continue to ease policy further is also bolstered by low inflation that is below the Fed's 2% target.

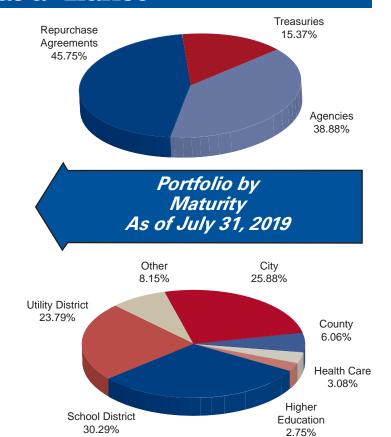

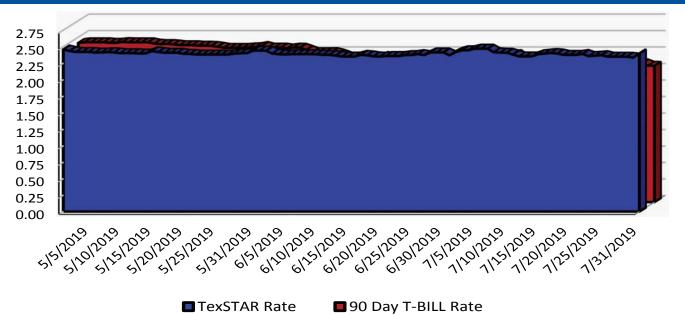

<u>Project Description/Background</u> –Travis County has approached Mobility Authority staff regarding the development of 6 projects:

- Old San Antonio Road from FM 1826 to Hays County Line widen to add shoulders
- Old Lockhart Road from Slaughter Lane to Thaxton Road widen to add shoulders
- County Line Road at Elm Creek replace bridge and approaches
- South Pleasant Valley Road from FM 1327 to south of River Plantation Drive construct new MAD 4
- Thaxton Road from McKinney Falls Parkway to Sassman Road reconstruct to MAD 4
- Pearce Lane from west of Kellam Road to Wolf Lane reconstruct to MAD 4

<u>Previous Actions/Brief History of the Project/Program</u> – At its March 28, 2018 meeting, the Board Authorized staff to enter into an interlocal agreement with Travis County for the development and delivery of the Elroy Road and Ross Road projects on behalf of Travis County as a part of their bond program aimed at providing enhanced mobility in the region. During the development of these two projects, County staff approached Mobility Authority staff and requested additional assistance in delivery of the bond program projects.

Staff has worked with Travis County to develop the attached interlocal agreement which provides for the development of the 6 projects listed above. Travis County will fund the project development and construction costs up to an approved budget amount plus reimburse the Mobility Authority a 2% administrative fee. Travis County Commissioners Court approved the interlocal agreement on August 27, 2019.

<u>Action requested/Staff Recommendation -</u> Staff is requesting approval of the draft resolution that will allow the Executive Director, or his designee, to execute the interlocal agreement and negotiate and execute contracts, work authorizations and task orders to complete the work contemplated through the interlocal agreement.

WHEREAS, Travis County has approached the Mobility Authority about the possibility of entering into an interlocal agreement to develop and deliver six projects identified in Travis County's 2017 Bond Program as shown on Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director and Travis County staff have negotiated an interlocal agreement for the Mobility Authority to develop and deliver the bond projects which is attached hereto as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the Travis County Commissioners Court approved the proposed interlocal agreement on August 27, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director recommends that the Board approve the proposed interlocal agreement and authorize him to take all such actions as are necessary to complete the work contemplated in the interlocal agreement including negotiating and executing contracts, work authorizations and task orders for the identified projects.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby approves the proposed interlocal agreement with Travis County and authorizes the Executive Director to finalize and execute the interlocal agreement on behalf of the Mobility Authority in the form or substantially the same form as attached hereto as Exhibit B; and

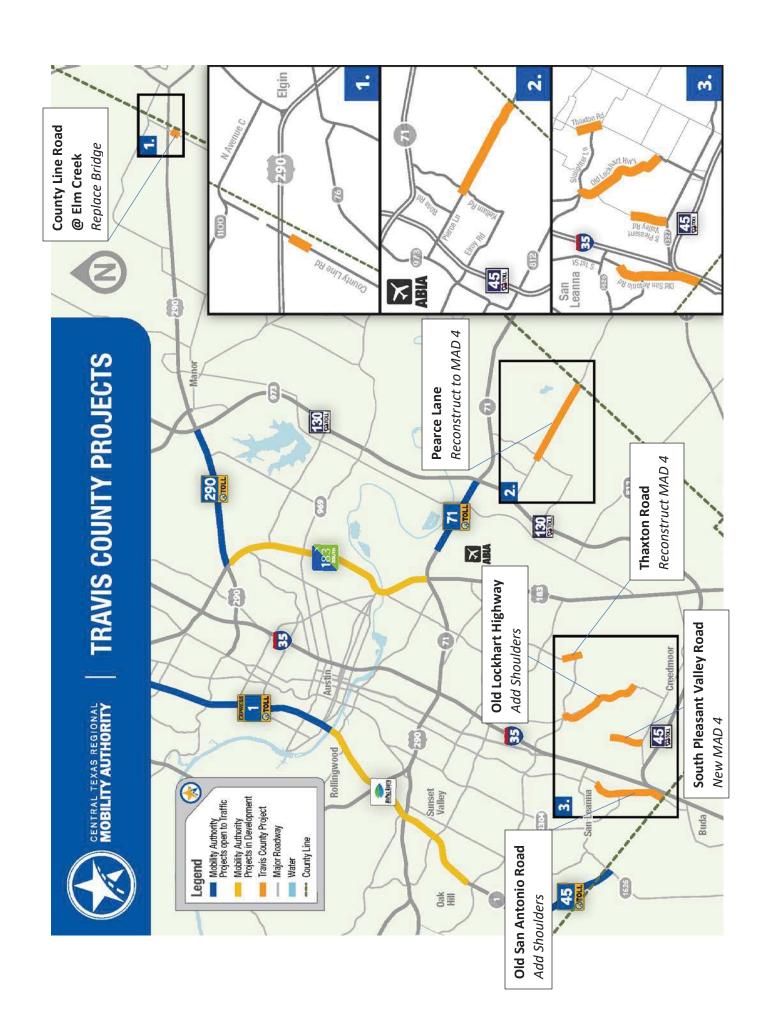

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

This Interlocal Cooperation Agreement ("Agreement") is between Travis County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (the "County"), and the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (the "Authority"). County and Authority may be referred to collectively in this Agreement as the "Parties," and individually as a "Party."

WHEREAS, the Parties intend to participate and collaborate under the direction and oversight of the County's Transportation and Natural Resources Division ("TNR") in the design and construction of the following projects:

- 1. Old San Antonio Road from FM 1826 to Hays County Line widen to add shoulders;
- 2. Old Lockhart Road from Slaughter Lane to Thaxton Road widen to add shoulders; and
- 3. County Line Road at Elm Creek replace bridge and approaches;

as well as the design oversight and construction of the following projects:

- 1. South Pleasant Valley Road from FM 1327 to south of River Plantation Drive construct new Four-Lane Major Arterial Divided roadway ("MAD 4");
- 2. Thaxton Road from McKinney Falls Parkway to Sassman Road reconstruct to MAD 4
- 3. Pearce Lane from west of Kellam Road to Wolf Lane reconstruct to MAD 4

as approved by motion of the Travis County Commissioners Court on August 27, 2019 (individually referred to herein as a "Project" and collectively as the "Projects"); and

WHEREAS, the Projects are generally described and depicted in the attached Exhibit 1; and

WHEREAS, the County has been tasked with completing the 2017 Bond Program within five (5) years, and in order to meet that deadline must evaluate alternative delivery methods and contracting with the CTRMA helps manage these Projects as an alternative delivery method in order to complete the 2017 Bond on time; and

WHEREAS, the County has agreed to fund the direct and indirect costs of the Projects as well as oversee the projects as detailed in this Agreement, and the Authority has agreed to manage the design, procurement, and/or construction of the Projects as detailed in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County will assign a County Project Manager from TNR to oversee all operations and act as the County's representative. The County Project Manager will direct and oversee the delivery of the Projects as outlined in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Parties, as political subdivisions of the State of Texas, intend for this Agreement to conform in all respects with the provisions of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Texas Government Code Section 791.001, et seq.;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Financial Obligations.

- (A) County will provide funding for each Project as outlined in the approved Budget for each Project further described in Section 1(E). The Authority will deposit all Project funds into separate Trust Accounts for each Project as directed by the County so as not to commingle the funds with other Authority projects.
- (B) County will provide the preliminary funding outlined in the approved Budget for each Project per the schedule included in attached Exhibit 2 after execution of this Agreement and upon availability of the funds.
- (C) The Authority may begin incurring expenses toward each individual Project upon approval of the Budget for that individual Project but will not be able to reimburse itself until this Agreement is fully executed, and the Project funds are deposited in the Project Trust Account. Refer to Section 1(J) for County approval necessary for disbursement from the Trust Account. The County may pay all or a portion of the Projects' costs using funds available from other sources, including funds provided to the County by third parties other than the Authority.
- (D) The Authority shall be entitled to funds up to a not-to-exceed amount of 2% of the actual total project cost (excluding purchase cost of right-of-way and utility relocation costs) for each Project to cover the administration expense of each Project by the Authority's staff. This 2% administration expense shall be included in the detailed Budget for each Project and shall be disbursed to the Authority on a pro-rata basis as funds are drawn down from the respective Trust Accounts to pay project costs.
- (E) Authority and County will jointly develop a detailed budget for each Project, including a cash flow projection and the County's projected funding sources ("Budget"). Each Budget will include the following costs to be paid by the Authority (from the appropriate Trust Account) to itself and to outside consultants, vendors, and the successful bidders on the construction contract for each of the Projects:
 - (1) preliminary engineering;
 - (2) capital costs (design and construction);
 - (3) engineering oversight (including design reviews, construction management, materials testing, inspection);
 - (4) legal, administrative, and other fees and expenses related to this Agreement, procurement, and Project development and oversight;
 - (5) environmental permits and approvals, if required;
 - (6) utility coordination services;
 - (7) right-of-way coordination, appraisal, and acquisition services;
 - (8) contingencies;
 - (9) the 2% administration expense described in Section 1(D); and
 - (10) all other costs reasonably projected as necessary to complete a Project, excluding any additional cost for a Party's in-kind services provided through a Party's employee.

- (F) A Budget will include a cash flow by yearly bond issuance for each County fiscal year. Payments will be made by phase (preliminary funding and construction funding) based on the Budget per the schedule outlined in Exhibit 2.
- (G) No later than ten (10) days after the County has approved each Budget, as evidenced by a written notice of Budget approval signed by the County Project Manager and delivered to the Authority, the County shall pay to the Authority an initial payment identified in the Budget as the preliminary funding for use by the Authority to pay Project costs incurred after the date of Budget approval. Upon completion of the preliminary funding phase, the Authority will provide notification to the County of the Advertisement to Bid for each Project at which time the County will have ten (10) days to deposit the construction funding into the Project Trust Account provided the funds are available per the schedule in Exhibit 2. If the Parties have not agreed on each Budget by October 1, 2019, or if the County fails to make any payment to the Authority required by each Budget, the Authority may terminate this Agreement in accordance with Section 5(A).
- (H) After a Budget is approved, it may be revised by written agreement of the County's Project Manager and the Authority's Program Manager. If the total cost of any one Project is projected to exceed the estimate set forth in the Budget for that Project, the Parties may engage in value engineering or other cost cutting measures in an attempt to control costs on any project or may identify contingency funds available from another of the Projects that can be transferred to the Project with the shortfall. If the projected combined costs of the Projects exceed funding available from the County from its own funds or from sources other than the Authority, the County may elect to provide the funds required to pay the additional Project costs. If the County fails to provide the funds required to pay excess Project costs, either Party may terminate this Agreement in accordance with Section 5(A). If either Party terminates this Agreement due to lack of funding, the County may be responsible for any demobilization and other costs associated with the termination.
- (I) The Authority shall have no obligation to execute a construction contract for any Project, or to issue a notice to proceed under a construction contract until County has paid all funds required by a Budget to fully fund the construction contract, related oversight and inspection costs, and the contingency fund established in the Budget for that Project.
- (J) Authority may disburse funds from each Trust Account to pay its administration expense, to pay its outside contractors and to pay the contract price for construction of the corresponding Project to the bidder selected for the contract, including any change orders approved under this Agreement. Any disbursement of funds must first be approved by the County Project Manager before the funds can be disbursed. The Authority will provide a summary of the proposed disbursement with appropriate back-up. The County will review the proposed disbursement within five (5) days of receipt and either approve the disbursement or provide comment otherwise. If County does not provide its approval or comments by the deadline, the County is deemed to have approved the disbursement. No later than two days after making any disbursement from the Trust Account, Authority will provide to County a copy of the disbursement.

- (K) Any interest earned on the funds in a Trust Account and is not used for Project expenditures shall be reported to the County and remitted back to the County following final project closeout.
- (L) Any funds remaining in a Trust Account shall be disbursed to County after the corresponding Project is accepted by the County as evidenced by a certificate of acceptance provided to the Authority, and after the Authority has disbursed and paid all Project expenses described in this section that were accrued and payable on the date of the County's acceptance.
- (M) Authority shall keep and maintain records to document and support that each disbursement made by Authority is for an authorized purpose under this Agreement. All of Authority's disbursements paid from a Trust Account shall be subject to audit by County at County's request and sole expense.
- (N) The Authority shall obtain written approval from the County before approving any proposed discretionary change order that would increase the cost of a Project as established in the corresponding Budget or that would delay the date required for substantial completion established by the construction contract for the Project. The Authority will notify and consult with the County on any proposed change order, but the Authority is hereby authorized to approve a proposed change order necessary with the concurrence of the County Project Manager to complete the Project as designed and scheduled; provided, however, that sufficient funds established by the Budget are available in the Trust Account to pay all costs resulting from the change order. If there are not adequate funds in the Trust Account for the change order, Authority will notify County of the need for the additional funds.
- (O) The County has contracted with a third-party Program Manager ("Third-Party Program Manager") who will support the County in tracking and scheduling County projects. The Authority agrees to coordinate with this Third-Party Program Manager by providing requested schedule and spending updates.

2. Project Development.

- (A) County will timely acquire and make available to the Authority all rights-of-way, licenses, easements of any nature and duration, and rights of possession needed to complete each Project. County will obtain any additional rights or rights-of-way needed for design changes or betterments to each Project requested and funded by the County. A portion or all right-of-way acquisition tasks can be delegated to the Authority if both parties agree and the Budget is modified to reflect the new scope.
- (B) The Authority shall provide ROW documents to the County on or before the date the 60% design comments have been cleared. The Authority shall prepare right-of-way maps ("strip maps"), property descriptions ("field notes" and "parcel plats"), and other data as needed to describe the right-of-way and access rights necessary for the Projects. The Authority shall be responsible for all real property record and land title research useful or necessary in preliminary and final determination of parcel acquisition needs and preparation of ROW documents. For purposes of this Agreement, ROW documents are further defined as comprehensive legal descriptions for all parcels wherein acquisition of real property interests, whether permanent or temporary, are required for construction of the Projects. Legal descriptions shall be comprised of

finalized parcel plats with metes and bounds descriptions, signed and sealed by a Registered Professional Land Surveyor currently licensed by the "Texas Board of Professional Land Surveying." All parcel plats and sketches shall depict the land area of the parcel, in addition to all improvements and significant natural vegetation located within or proximate to that land area. Copies of this data shall be delivered to the County for review at least three weeks before beginning the standard process for acquisition of right-of-way for each of the Projects. All surveying for ROW documents shall be tied to the Texas State Plane Coordinate System and must be located relative to all adjoining projects. Following the County's acceptance of ROW documents, the Authority shall provide right-of-way line and on-site parcel staking whenever requested by the County, or its agents and assigns, for use in appraisal, land-planning, and activities associated with property owner negotiations.

- (C) Utility relocations required for the Projects will be a joint responsibility. Depending on which Party is allocated funds for utility work in the Budget, the Authority and/or the County's design consultant will perform the utility investigations, identify utility conflicts and coordinate relocations or protection in place plans with the utilities. The County will enter into any utility agreements required for the projects and will be responsible for making payments, if any, as required per the applicable utility agreements. The County agrees to provide such permits and easements as may be necessary for the Authority to accomplish the relocation of utilities. The County will cooperate with the Authority in securing the performance of all necessary utility relocations. The County will coordinate with the Authority regarding the placement or relocation of any utility within or on the Projects to minimize and mitigate any disruption to the construction of the Projects.
- (D) The design, plans, and specifications for each Project shall comply with applicable local, state, and federal regulations and standards and shall be sealed by a Texas Registered Professional Engineer.
- (E) The Authority will manage the design and construction of the Old San Antonio Road, Old Lockhart Road, and County Line Road Projects and will provide design oversight and manage the construction of the South Pleasant Valley Road, Thaxton Road, and Pearce Road Projects pursuant to applicable and agreed criteria, including (i) development of the engineering design, plans and specifications for all roadway improvements; (ii) the surveying; (iii) the construction; and (iv) inspection and testing.
- (F) For the three projects that the Authority will manage design and construction:

When design work for each design package is 30% complete, 60% complete, and again when the design work for each design package is 90% complete, Authority shall submit the complete design package to the County Project Manager. County Project Manager will review and provide comments on the design package to the Authority. The Parties will participate in joint monthly coordination and review meetings with representatives from all affected County reviewers to avoid or resolve conflicts in review comments. County agrees to complete its review and notify the Authority of its approval or disapproval of the design package no later than 5 days after receiving the design package. If County does not provide its approval or disapproval by the deadline, the County is deemed to have approved the design package. If County disapproves of the information submitted, the County shall at the

same time notify Authority of the reasons for the disapproval and actions necessary for the design package to meet County approval. Authority will have an opportunity to correct or submit additional information to cure any defects or deviations identified by County. Any defects or deviations will be discussed in an over-the-shoulder review meeting and incorporated into the next submittal.

For the three projects that the Authority will provide design oversight and manage construction:

The Authority's Project Manager will provide project management services in support of the design contract procured by the County. These services may include various tasks related to the development of construction documents, as well as participate in public meetings to present alternatives to the community. The Authority will coordinate with the design consultant and will review the design package submittals. The Authority agrees to coordinate and complete its review and notify the County of its approval or disapproval of the design package no later than 5 days after receiving the design package. If the Authority does not provide approval or disapproval by the deadline, the Authority is deemed to have approved the design package. If the Authority disapproves of the information submitted, it shall at the same time notify the County of the reasons for its disapproval and actions necessary for the design package to meet Authority approval. Any defects or deviations will be discussed in an over-the-shoulder review meeting with all parties involved and incorporated into the next submittal.

- (G) When applicable, the Authority in cooperation with the County shall be responsible for permitting, obtaining, unless waived, an approved Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMR), and Letter of Map Revision (LOMR), and environmental assessments and clearances associated with each Project. Authority agrees to develop and construct each Project on an expedited timetable in accordance with the corresponding Budget using resources and procurement methods available to and as determined by the Authority
- (H) The Authority will ensure that its design engineer for each of the three projects for which it is managing design provides professional liability, automobile liability, and general liability insurance in accordance with the standard requirements of the County. The Authority will ensure the Authority and the County are named as additional insureds with respect to such general liability and automobile liability coverage.
- (I) The Authority will implement its MoveFWD Program during the construction phase of each of the Projects. This Program leverages local construction projects to provide potential job opportunities to local veterans, homeless, near-homeless, ex-offenders, and the under-trained and under-certified. This initiative connects candidates to potential employers by providing job placement and training. The Authority will require all contractors and subcontractors comply with the County's livable wage rates, to the extent allowed by law.
- (J) The Authority will make a good faith effort to encourage HUB participation at the same level as required for all County projects as described in the County Code Chapter 32, section 32.008 and the County purchasing procedures guide. The Authority or its designee will enter payment data into the County's Vendor Tracking System (VTS) identifying HUB percentages utilized for each project.

3. Project Bidding & Award of Construction Contract.

- (A) The Authority will be responsible for the solicitation of bids for the construction of each Project based on the approved plans and specifications and in accordance with the Authority's bidding policies, laws, practices, and procedures. The Authority will notify the County of the lowest responsible bidder and the amount of the bid for each Project. The County Project Manager will have 5 days to review the Authority's recommendation for award and must give written approval before the Authority can award the contract.
- (B) County and Authority will consult on necessary or desirable provisions to be included in any construction contract for a Project procured by the Authority. Any construction contract executed by the Authority shall include, without limitation, indemnification protection provisions for Authority and County, a deadline for substantial completion of the Project; possible inclusion of incentive/ disincentive clauses in relation to meeting an agreed to schedule, if the delay is not attributable to the Authority, the County, or a force majeure event; and provisions establishing the right of the Authority to assign the construction contract to County upon the County's acceptance of the substantial completion of the Project, together with all contractor's warranties, guarantees, and bonds.

Project Management.

- (A) The Authority will act on behalf of the County with respect to each Project. The Authority agrees to coordinate with the County to interpret and define the County's policies and decisions with respect to each Project. If a dispute arises, the County's decision will be final. The Authority will designate a Program Manager and may designate other representatives to transmit instructions and act on behalf of the Authority with respect to each Project. The Authority will deliver monthly reports to County regarding financial, design and construction progress. The Authority, on request, will appear before the Commissioners Court for briefings.
- (B) The County Project Manager will act on behalf of the County with respect to each Project, coordinate with the Authority, receive and transmit information and instructions, and will have complete authority to interpret, define, and communicate the County's policies and decisions with respect to each Project. The County Project Manager may designate other representatives to transmit instructions and act on behalf of the County with respect to the Project.

5. Default; Termination; Dispute Resolution.

- (A) Either Party may terminate this Agreement if the other Party defaults in its obligation and, after receiving notice of the default and of the non-defaulting Party's intent to terminate, fails to cure the default no later than five days after receipt of that notice. Otherwise, this Agreement will terminate on the date when all Trust Account funds have been disbursed in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- (B) If a disagreement between Authority and County arises regarding engineering design, design and construction standards, plans and specifications, inspection and testing, deficiencies and remedial action, change orders, or any other requirement or provision of this Agreement, and the

disagreement is not resolved by the Authority's Program Manager and the County Project Manager, it shall be referred as soon as possible to the Authority's Executive Director (or his designee) and TNR's Deputy Director (or his designee).

- (C) When mediation is acceptable to both parties, the parties may use a mutually acceptable mediator, or a mediator appointed by a court of competent jurisdiction. Mediation is conducted in compliance with Chapter 154 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. Unless both parties are satisfied with the mediated resolution, the mediation is not a final and binding resolution of the dispute. All communications within the scope of the mediation must remain confidential in compliance with section 154.073 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, unless both parties agree in writing to waive confidentiality.
- 6. <u>Liability</u>. To the extent allowed by Texas law, County and Authority agree that each Party is responsible for its own proportionate share of any liability for personal injury or death or property damage arising out of or connected to its negligent acts or omissions in connection with this Agreement as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction. Neither County nor Authority waives, relinquishes, limits or conditions its governmental immunity or any other right to avoid liability which it otherwise might have to a third party. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating any liability in favor of any third party or parties against either County or Authority, nor shall it ever be construed as relieving any third party or parties from any liabilities of such third party or parties to County or the Authority.

7. Miscellaneous.

- (A) <u>Force Majeure</u>. Whenever a period of time is prescribed by this Agreement for action to be taken by either Party, the Party shall not be liable or responsible for, and there shall be excluded from the computation of any such period of time, any delays due to strikes, riots, acts of God, shortages of labor or materials, war, terrorist acts or activities, governmental laws, regulations, or restrictions, or any other causes of any kind whatsoever which are beyond the control of such party.
- (B) Notice. All notices, demands or other requests, and other communications required or permitted under this Agreement or which any Party may desire to give, shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been given on the sooner to occur of (i) receipt by the Party to whom the notice is hand-delivered, with a written receipt of notice provided by the receiving Party, or (ii) two days after deposit in a regularly maintained express mail receptacle of the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, or registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, express mail delivery, addressed to such Party at the respective addresses set forth below, or such other address as each Party may from time to time designate by written notice to the others as herein required or (iii) electronic mail transmission (the latter of scanned documents in formats such as .pdf or .tif) for which confirmation of receipt by the other Party has been obtained by the sending Party:

- (C) <u>Calculation of Days</u>. Each reference in this Agreement to a day or days refers to a day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday observed by both the County and the Authority. If the last day of any period described in this Agreement is a Saturday, Sunday, or such legal holiday, the period is extended to include the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or such legal holiday.
- (D) Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains the complete and entire Agreement between the Parties respecting the matters addressed herein, and supersedes all prior negotiations, agreements, representations, and understanding, if any, between the Parties respecting the Projects. This Agreement may not be modified, discharged, or changed in any respect whatsoever except by a further agreement in writing duly executed by authorized representatives of the Parties hereto. The recitals set forth above and the attached exhibits are incorporated herein.
- (E) <u>Effective Date</u>. This Agreement takes effect upon the last date of due execution of the Agreement by the County and the Authority.
- (F) Other Instruments. The Parties hereto covenant and agree that they will execute other and further instruments and documents as may become necessary or convenient to effectuate and carry out the purposes of this Agreement.
- (G) <u>Invalid Provision</u>. Any clause, sentence, provision, paragraph, or article of this agreement held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or ineffective shall not impair, invalidate, or nullify the remainder of this Agreement, but the effect thereof shall be confined to the clause, sentence, provision, paragraph, or article so held to be invalid, illegal, or ineffective.

<u>Background -</u> CTRMA provides employees a retirement benefit managed through the Texas County & District Retirement System (TCDRS). This benefit can provide a cost of living adjustment (COLA) granted annually by the Board to active retirees drawing their pension. A COLA increases a retiree's benefit to make up for the loss of buying power due to inflation.

Currently, three former CTRMA employees, or their beneficiaries, are collecting retirement benefits through TCDRS. This is the first time the Board has considered adopting a benefit adjustment.

The TCDRS system allows for two types of retiree COLAs:

<u>Flat-rate</u>: Increases the benefit amounts of all CTRMA retirees by the same percentage. With this type of adjustment, the benefit payment increases by a percentage of the Board's choosing up to the limit set by the TCDRS Board of Trustees each year. The TRDRS Board reviews this annually and most recently adopted a maximum 2% flat-rate increase.

<u>CPI-based</u>: With this type of adjustment, the Board may choose to increase CTRMA retirees' benefit payments by a percentage based on the increase in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U), an index the federal government uses to measure inflation. Each retiree's benefit is individually increased according to how much inflation has occurred as measured by the CPI-U. The Board chooses a percentage of CPI-U change you wish to cover. The TCDRS plan allows a range between 10% and 100% of the CPI-U. A CPI-based

COLA, specific for each individual retiree, helps restore the lost buying power for each retiree, based on their original benefit payment amount and how much inflation has occurred since they started receiving the benefit. The calculation for the CPI-based COLA for each retiree is done by TCDRS.

The type of COLA (Flat-rate vs CPI-based) can be changed from year to year at the time of the annual Board adoption.

<u>Financing</u> – CTRMA currently provides 102.2% of the Funded Ratio by contributing at a contribution rate of 14.00% vs the required rate of 12.00% of employee salaries for the required employer contribution rate. This additional contribution rate has prepared CTRMA to fund these retiree COLAs. Each CTRMA employee also contributes 7.00% to the TCDRS retirement system.

<u>Action Requested</u> – Staff recommends adopting the <u>CPI-based</u> retiree COLA at 100% of the CPI-U to be effective January 1, 2020 and adopting a Policy Code change to add the requirement that the Board consider retiree COLAs on an annual basis.

APPROVING A COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENT FOR MOBILITY AUTHORITY RETIREES AND ADOPTING A RETIREE BENEFIT POLICY

WHEREAS, in Resolution No. 04-19, dated May 5, 2004, the Board of Directors approved participation by the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority ("Mobility Authority") in the Texas County & District Retirement System ("TCDRS") to provide benefits to Mobility Authority employees under the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority TCDRS Plan (the "Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the Plan requires certain authorizations from time to time by the Board of Directors regarding ongoing provisions of and/or changes to the Plan; and

WHEREAS, former Mobility Authority employees and/or their beneficiaries, are collecting retirement benefits through TCDRS; and

WHEREAS, the Plan provides an annual opportunity for a retiree cost-of-living adjustment ("COLA"); and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer of the Mobility Authority recommends adopting a one-year retiree COLA to be effective January 1, 2020 at 100% of the CPI-based retiree COLA established by TCDRS; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director recommends amending the Mobility Authority Policy Code by adopting a new Article 3, Subchapter E regarding Employee Retirement Benefits which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby approves and adopts a one-year retiree COLA to be effective January 1, 2020 at 100% of the CPI-based COLA established by TCDRS; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Directors hereby amends the Mobility Authority Policy Code by adopting a new Article 3, Subchapter E regarding Employee Retirement Benefits in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to execute such documents and take all other actions necessary to implement the one-year retiree COLA approved herein.

Article 3. ADMINISTRATION

Subchapter E. EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT BENEFITS

101.0631 Texas County and District Retirement System Plan

- (a) The authority participates in the Texas County & District Retirement System (TCDRS), which is a multi-employer, defined benefit pension plan under section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. The authority contributes a percentage of employee salaries for the required employer contribution rate. Each CTRMA employee is required to contribute 7.00% of their salary to the TCDRS retirement system.
- (b) The authority's TCDRS Plan includes provisions for annual cost of living adjustments. The board shall consider adopting a cost of living adjustment for retirees receiving a pension each year in conjunction with adopting the annual budget.

101.0632 Deferred Compensation 457(b) Plan

(a) The authority provides employees an opportunity to defer compensation for retirement via a 457 (b) plan, a type of non-qualified, tax advantaged deferred-compensation retirement plan that is available for governmental and certain non-governmental employers in the United States. The employer provides the plan and the employee voluntarily defers compensation into the plan.

WHEREAS, Section 1.150-2(d)(2) of the Treasury Regulations sets forth limitations regarding the timing of reimbursements made from the proceeds of certain tax-exempt obligations.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that:

- Section 1. The Authority reasonably expects to reimburse itself for costs that have been or will be paid subsequent to the date that is 60 days prior to the date hereof and that are to be paid in connection with the acquisition, construction, reconstruction or renovation of the Financed Project from the proceeds of obligations to be issued subsequent to the date hereof.
- Section 2. The Authority reasonably expects that the maximum principal amount of obligations issued to reimburse the Authority for the costs associated with the Financed Project will be \$20,000,000. Such obligations may be issued in one or more series.
- Section 3. Unless otherwise advised by bond counsel, any reimbursement allocation will be made not later than 18 months after the later of (1) the date the original expenditure is paid or (2) the date on which the Financed Project is placed in service or abandoned, but in no event more than three years after the original expenditure is paid.

<u>Project Description</u> – The 183 North Mobility Project ("Project") will expand capacity along a nine mile stretch of US 183 between SH 45 North and MoPac by adding two tolled express lanes in each direction in the middle of US 183. Additionally, the Project will expand the existing US 183 to four non-tolled general-purpose lanes in each direction, construct a shared use path, and construct sidewalks along the frontage roads between SH 45 North/RM 620 and Loop 1. The project also includes the addition of a direct connector between the existing express lanes on MoPac and the proposed express lanes on US 183 as well as additional operational improvements south along MoPac. This Project will allow for improved commutes from north Austin and Williamson County to downtown Austin.

The Mobility Authority's current cost estimate for the Design-Build contract is approximately \$350 million.

<u>Previous Actions/Brief History of the Project</u> – On April 27, 2016, the Mobility Authority received environmental approval for the development of the 183 North Project through the issuance of a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) by the Texas Department of Transportation ("TxDOT").

On April 26, 2017, the Mobility Authority exercised its option as a local toll project entity to develop, finance, construct, and operate the 183 North Project.

On January 31, 2019, the Texas Transportation Commission approved the release of \$104.2 million in federal funding for the non-tolled portion of the Project.

On May 24, 2019, the Mobility Authority received five Statements of Qualification, from which the following three Proposers were short-listed:

- 1. Capital Express Partners
- 2. Colorado River Constructors
- 3. Great Hills Constructors

Draft Requests for Detailed Proposals (RFDP) documents were issued to these short-listed Proposers on August 9, 2019, consequent to Board approval on July 24, 2019.

In parallel with the above procurement process the Mobility Authority has been developing a draft Project Development Agreement (PDA) with TxDOT. Execution of a PDA with TxDOT is a requirement for implementation of the Project. This agreement establishes the respective obligations of the Mobility Authority and TxDOT for the financing, procurement, design, and construction of the Project.

Next Steps

Staff from the Mobility Authority and TxDOT will continue to develop the PDA to achieve agreement on a discrete number of currently unresolved issues. Both parties have committed to execute the PDA prior to issuing final RFDP documents in November 2019.

<u>Financing</u> – Funding for the tolled portion of the Project will be provided through a combination of toll revenue bonds and Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (TIFIA) funds. The PDA will include terms for funding the non-tolled portion of the Project through reimbursement from TxDOT against costs incurred.

<u>Action Requested/Staff Recommendation</u> – Staff recommends that the Board Authorize the Executive Director to negotiate and execute a Project Development Agreement with TxDOT, including terms for financing the non-tolled portion of the 183 North Mobility Project.

WHEREAS, by Minute Order No. 115406, dated January 31, 2019, TxDOT authorized up to \$120 million in funding for the TxDOT Improvements, subject to the terms specified therein; and

WHEREAS, the Mobility Authority and TxDOT are required to execute a project development agreement ("PDA") governing the development of the 183 North Mobility Project; and

WHEREAS, the PDA negotiated by the Mobility Authority and TxDOT will govern the development, design, construction, maintenance and operation of the 183 North Mobility Project and TxDOT's financial contribution to the TxDOT Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director recommends that the Board authorize him, in consultation with the Board Chairman, to negotiate, finalize and execute a PDA with TxDOT for the 183 North Mobility Project.

Approve Change Order No. 23 to the contract with McCarthy Building Companies, Inc. for construction of the SH 45SW Toll Project

Action Requested: Consider and act on draft resolution

<u>Project Description</u> – 45SW Toll is an innovative 3.6-mile four-lane toll road built on state property between MoPac and FM 1626 that's bringing relief to the rapidly growing area of northern Hays and southern Travis counties. To limit the impact to the surrounding environment, 45SW does not have frontage roads. The project includes a ten-foot-wide shared use path that is separated from the roadway for the entire length of the project, except over the Bear Creek Bridge. The shared use path will serve as part of the future Violet Crown Trail and has trailheads under the bridge structures at the intersections with MoPac and Bliss Spillar Road. Access to 45SW is available from FM 1626, Bliss Spillar Road, MoPac, and SH 45 west of MoPac.

Previous Actions/Brief History of the Project/Program – In July 2016, the contract for 45SW construction services was provisionally awarded to McCarthy Building Companies (MBC). On November 1, 2016, the Mobility Authority entered a contractual agreement with MBC and construction officially commenced. On December 21, 2016, the Board authorized the Executive Director to approve change orders up to \$1 million on the 45SW project without Board consideration or approval. The road was opened to traffic and considered substantially complete on June 1, 2019.

Action requested – Since this item is over \$1,000,000 in value, Board approval is required. This item provides compensation for MBC Change Order Request 023 for construction services provided on the 45SW Toll Road. MBC encountered substantially and materially different conditions throughout portions of the project during excavation than those indicated in contract documents. Therefore, these conditions were not expected or anticipated at the time of the contract bid. Underground boulders ranging from 2-foot to 8-foot in size were encountered while excavating for storm sewer, retaining walls, and bridge substructures. These incompressible boulders required the setup of an unplanned rock crushing operation to process boulders to a size deemed allowable within the embankment of the project. Due to environmental limitations, the rock crusher could only be set up in one area and excessive trucking was needed to haul rock to process then haul back to place in embankment. MBC is requesting \$1,570,580.74in compensation to cover the cost of removal of the excessive rock and processing it for on-site use.

<u>Financing</u> - The change order will be paid using 45SW project contingency funds.

<u>Staff Recommendation</u> - Staff recommends approval of this item, proposed Change Order 023, which will provide an additional \$1,570,580.74 for construction services on 45SW Toll to McCarthy Building Companies.

Exhibit A

Description of Change Order

This Change Order pricing is for the additional effort to address a differing site condition encountered on the project after the start of construction. The contractor encountered excessive and oversized boulders during excavations for storm sewer, retaining walls, and bridge substructures at the onset of construction that were materially different from those indicated in the Contract Documents. The contractor also could not salvage the expected amount of topsoil as a result of encountering rocks and boulders at a much shallower depth than expected. These differences could not have been reasonably anticipated or quantified at the time of bidding. Bore logs indicated rock that was represented as very hard or weathered. Instead, loose rock and boulders up to 8 ft were encountered during excavations. These boulders could not be broken in place nor could this material be hauled off the project due to contract stipulations. In discussions with the CEI and CTRMA, the contractor proposed to resolve this differing site condition by setting up a rock crushing operation to process all the large boulders on site to a size that was deemed allowable by the project documents and to be utilized within the embankment of the project. This operation also included screening topsoil and other excavated material to remove excessive rock in order to utilize the salvaged topsoil throughout the corridor. Since this operation was an unforeseen and unplanned effort, the contractor could not be expected to cover these additional costs. These costs are the agreed upon compensation for the contractor's extra effort to address and mitigate the excessive and oversized boulders encountered on the project.

RS&H has reviewed and negotiated the unit price based on the guidelines set out in Item 9 of the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) Specification. The change order pricing was negotiated based on cost of material, labor, and equipment basis as outlined in the cost breakdown attached.



The cost for this work is specific to the work performed, therefore there is no direct low bid unit price data which to use for comparisons from TxDOT or other sources. Due to this unforeseen and unplanned operation, the contractor submitted the pricing on their costs as outlined in the cost breakdown attached. As communicated over the last few months, during McCarthy's work on excavation for storm drains, retaining walls, bridge substructure, and other locations we have encountered conditions substantially and materially different from those indicated in the Contract Documents. The referenced differing site conditions could not have been reasonably anticipated or quantified as inherent or normal to this work activity. The following is a detailed explanation of the differing site conditions encountered at the site.

From the boring logs and associated Geotechnical report, the overburden stratum averages a thickness of less than 5' and is composed primarily of clay, gravel, and/or sand. The Geotechnical Report states the lower stratum is typically limestone, 70% of which is classified as very hard. Over half of the borings are classified as moderately weathered and moderately fractured, with the remainder varying from slightly weathered to completely weathered and unfractured to highly fractured. From this data, McCarthy anticipated at bid time that excavated material would be consolidated enough to remove only what was required for construction utilizing backhoes or trenchers and the material could be incorporated directly into the fill. In actuality, much of the subsurface material has been found to be segregated into individual incompressible boulders ranging in sizes from 2' to 8' separated by cohesive or granular material. The bid documents did not define the majority of the excavation to be uncompressible boulders.

These loose boulders cannot be broken in place and must be removed regardless of their location within the neatline excavation grades. This has resulted in a great deal of over-excavation and replacement with suitable material, as well as a large stockpile of unsuitable material in the form of boulders that will either require haul-off from the site or on-site processing/crushing to reduce them to a useable size to be incorporated into the fill.

In accordance with the Texas Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Construction of Highways, Streets and Bridges, Section 4.5, we are writing to inform you of this differing subsurface condition in order for you to investigate the conditions. McCarthy will work toward quantifying the impacts to the cost and/or Contract durations once the disposition of the unsuitable material is determined.

We are ready to meet with you at your earliest convenience to discuss this changed condition. Please do not hesitate to call us if any further information is required at this time.

As we have discussed in our meetings and noted in our letter dated August 6, 2017 to the CTRMA, we have experienced differing sites conditions from what could be reasonably expected for underground rock and boulders. During McCarthy's work stripping topsoil, excavating ditches, ponds, storm drains, retaining walls, bridge structures and other locations, our crews have encountered substantially and materially different soil conditions from those indicated on the contract bid documents. These differences could not have been reasonably anticipated or quantified as inherent or normal at the time of bidding the project nor were there provisions allowed in the documents to employ the proper means to fully investigate actual conditions. In addition, McCarthy will also submit a change order request for the importation of topsoil. The lack of topsoil being a direct result of excessive rock, as stated above, and the fact that the project was unable to generate the anticipated amount of topsoil as outlined in the contract documents.

As stated in the previous notice, the boring logs do not reveal what we actually encountered on site. The bore logs indicated clay, gravel, and/or sand upper stratum through the majority of the project. Wherever rock is indicated on the bore logs it is represented as very hard to completely weathered rock. From this description, McCarthy anticipated at bid time that the excavated material would be solid enough to remove, only what was required for construction, utilizing backhoes or trenchers, and the material could be incorporated directly into the fill. In actuality, much of the subsurface material has been found to be segregated into individual incompressible boulders ranging in size up to 8', or the size of small vehicles. The amount of rock and boulders could not have been anticipated by the bid documents.

The loose rock and boulders could not be broken in place and had to be removed regardless of the size and location within the neat-line excavation grades. This resulted in a large amount of over-excavation and an increase in materials to backfill excavations where required. In essence, the boulders exponentially impacted all earth (ground) engaging operations, increasing the quantity of material from what was indicated on the documents.

Due to the excessive amount of rock on the project, McCarthy was required to set up a rock crushing operation, essentially an unplanned, independent rock crushing station at one end of the project to process all of the large boulders on site to a size that was deemed allowable by the project documents within the embankment of the project. In addition to the crushing operation, we also had to mobilize equipment to screed the topsoil and other excavated material to remove rock so the topsoil could be incorporated into the site and the excess rock could be separated for further / additional processing.



Neither of these operations could have been anticipated at the time of bid from the information provided. Due to the environmental limitation of Prohibited Activity Layout (PAL) areas the rock crushing operation could only be set up at one location of the project. This caused excessive trucking through the project of the rock and boulders to the processing area and then back to the location of final embankment. In essence, this unforeseen condition lead to material that had to be harvested, trucked to one location, processed through a multitude of crushing operations, then further segregated, re-trucked and then mixed or blended into suitable embankment material.

The bid documents contributed to this additional scope for the following reasons:

- No subsurface investigation was allowed prior to bid due to environmental sequencing.
- Visual observation, which was allowed, is not indicative of what was found subsurface on site.
 (See attached photos of CEZ zones that demonstrate what the pre-bid visual would have indicated)
- The Geotechnical Data Report provided by Fugro clearly indicates and defines what material is to be anticipated at every elevation per the 106 bores taken. (See cross sections with rock layer indicated and quantification of rock estimate explanation below)
- The bid documents are clear, because of environmental reasons, that no export of material excavated on-site is allowed (See attached plan sheet 41A Item 100) therefore requiring the rock to be processed to 6" (See attached plan sheet 41A Item 132) and deposited in embankments.
- The same situation described in this request is also the root cause and contributing factor for the importation of topsoil on what should have yielded a surplus of topsoil. i.e. differing sub-surface site conditions in relation to the bid documents.

For background, McCarthy estimates our Civil Transportation projects using AGTEK software, whereby we overlay the existing cross sections against the proposed cross sections and insert the boring information from the Geotechnical report. This provides us with the amount of cut/fill on the project as well as the type of material to be cut at each location. Our estimate did anticipate some rock excavations. Based on bore logs we actually encountered rock and boulders at elevations not represented. For the scope of work represented in the bid documents McCarthy is seeking no additional compensation as it was identified in the bid documents and we competitively bid our process to address that known rock.

What is not in our bid, and therefore the CTRMA has not paid for, are the boulders and rock outlined above that resulted in approximately three times the rock crushing across a nine month period of time. In addition, the harvesting of those boulders subsequently caused additional excavation and embankment for scope already identified in the documents. Couple this resultant added scope with added time and support of this diverted operation and the result is our attached request for \$1,570,580.74. Again, the CTRMA will not being paying twice for this scope, as it was not identified in the bid documents.

Please see the attached pricing and backup for the excessive rock on the project. McCarthy requests that a date and time be set up to review our impacts with you in person, as they exceed six figures, and determine a path forward to reach a mutually acceptable conclusion to the open issues on the project.



Please advise what schedule is convenient for you and what other clarifications McCarthy may provide in preparation for our discussion.

Dear Mr. Chance,

This is the pricing breakdown for the pricing submitted with the COR 033. Each line is explained below.

- Excavate by Backhoe Labor (overrun of estimate) The additional labor for excavating the project due to excessive rock.
- Backhoe Equipment to support additional Labor The rate was figured with an excavator. We have attached an invoice plus the bluebook operating costs for this excavator. The time was figured at half of the labor hours. This is to take in consideration of a laborer for ¼ of the hours and a foreman for ¼ of the hours. The remaining half of the hours is for an operator.
- Excavate by Dozer Labor (overrun of estimate) The additional labor for excavating the project due to excessive rock.
- Dozer to Support Additional Labor The rate was figured using the FHWA bluebook rate for a McCarthy owned D6N dozer. The time was figured at half of the labor hours. This is to take in consideration of a laborer for ¼ of the hours and a foreman for ¼ of the hours. The remaining half of the hours is for an operator.
- D8 to Rip Rock A D8 dozer was brought in specifically to rip rock along ditches in the interchange area of the project.
- Crush Rock Labor McCarthy setup an individual tracking code for the rock processing operation at the stockpiles.
- Rip Break Rock Labor (overrun of estimate) The additional labor for ripping and breaking rock. This item was originally set up to support a subcontractor trenching and plaining rock. As discussed in the COR request, the equipment could not be used due to boulders.
- Screen Labor McCarthy setup an individual tracking code for the screening of rock to be processed due to the excessive amount of rock in the topsoil.
- Breakers used on the project This is for the number of hydraulic breakers that were required on project to excavate rock and process rock that was not anticipated due to representation of the bid documents.
- Support Equipment for Breakers This is for the equipment that used to operate the breakers. If
 a breaker was rented with out being a combo package a piece of equipment was needed to
 support the breaker. An example of this is if a breaker is rented there is an excavator needed to
 run the breaker.
- Equipment Billed to Crush Rock This is for the equipment that was billed directly to the stockpile operation, primarily the jaw crusher.



- Equipment to support Crush Rock Equipment This is for the excavator that was used to feed the crusher. Equipment that overlapped for this operation was removed from the pricing.
- Bucket Crusher This is for the bucket crusher that was rented prior to being able to get a permit for the jaw crusher.
- Equipment to Support the Bucket Crusher This is for the excavator that was used with the bucket crusher.
- Screener for Rock/Topsoil—This is the expense for renting a screener to screen the rock from the dirt due to the excessive amount of rock in the topsoil.
- Equipment to Support the Screener This is for the loader used to feed the screener.
- Tekrock dollars not used This is the credit for a subcontractor McCarthy priced in the estimate for trenching and plaining on the project. McCarthy was unable to use the subcontractor due to the excessive amount of boulders.
- Off road Trucks (to rock crusher) this is for the expense of moving material to the rock crusher for processing. The moving of material to final location was included in the original estimated costs. This is figured at 5 months at 172Hr/month.
- Rock Crushing Permit Expense associated with obtaining permits to operate a rock crusher on site.

Items to note:

- Fuel/Service/Parts is added to McCarthy owned items at the bluebook operating cost rate. All other equipment uses a 40% Operating Cost Rate.
- No overtime factor or burden is added to the labor prices as the prices are inclusive of overtime and burden.
- No taxes are added to the material as the material invoice has tax included.

Geotech Representation Explanation

- The TxDOT Geotechnical Manual lists the material description order, one of which is "descriptive adjectives". There is no guidance what adjectives to use and no definitions are given. As the descriptive adjectives are "engineer dependent", without definitions we would have no way of knowing what these adjectives are intended to mean.
- The Geotechnical Report and soil borings for SH45 Southwest prepared by Fugro make no mention of "boulders", other than in the "Terms and Symbols Used on TxDOT Boring Logs" legend page describing soil grain size. On this scale, the largest soil grain size mentioned in the borings is "gravel" which is up to 3" sieve.



- The TxDOT Geotechnical Manual refers to ASTM D2487, Tex-141-E, and Tex-142-E for guidance on standard classifications based on the Unified Soil Classification System
 - ASTM D2487
 - Makes no mention of "fractured", "fragments", or "weathered" and does not provide examples of "descriptive adjectives".
 - Defines "boulders" as particles of rock not passing a 12" square opening.
 - A footnote to the table in 4. Summary states, "if field sample contained cobbles or boulders, or both, add 'with cobbles or boulders, or both' to the group name of the soil."
 - The procedure for classifying coarse-grained soil note. 12.7 states, "If the field sample contained any cobbles or boulders or both, the words 'with cobbles' or 'with cobbles and boulders' shall be added to the group name." The TxDOT Glossary defines "shall or will" as "a mandatory requirement".
 - Examples in X1 and X5 indicate that a "b" should be included in the soil
 classification if boulders are present and the presence of boulders or cobbles
 are to be listed in the group name.
 - o Tex-141-E
 - Makes no mention of "fractured", "fragments", or "weathered"
 - Includes in Table 1 "Soil Description Information" for descriptions that the shape of gravel, cobbles, and boulders defined by their dimensions and dimensional ratios should be included

Tex-142-E relates to laboratory soil testing, thus contains no information pertinent to the field observation of cobbles and

Work over or near Bodies of Water (Lakes, Rivers, Ponds, Creeks, etc.).

Submit "Initial Phase"tree/vegetative clearing activities plan for review no later than one month before clearing activities. Include the following in the plan:

• Name and experience record of superintendent who will be in charge of the clearing

operations for this project.

Summary:

Background - Fagan Consulting LLC has served as the Authority's general system consultant under a competitively-bid contract since 2014. Fagan Consulting provides a wide range of services to the Mobility Authority in the areas of systems expertise, strategic guidance and operational recommendations. Recent projects include assisting in the procurement and deployment of the Cofiroute back office solution in which Fagan documented system requirements and business rules; participated in negotiating and establishing the third-party back office processing flow; led system testing; and monitored key billing and customer communication process. Finally, Fagan Consulting continues to monitor the Cofiroute system to ensure that its meets the Authority's business objectives and needs.

Fagan has also been instrumental in evaluating products such as automated license plate readers (ALPRs) to support the Authority's habitual violator program; performing costs analyses; conducting monthly audits of the Authority's lane system in the areas of vehicle detection and classification; benchmarking industry best practices to aid in the development of toll system integrator key performance indicators; and advising on national interoperability matters.

More recently Fagan assisted in developing a long-range vision for replacing the Authority's toll management system and developing a modular toll host that will allow other entities such as RMAs and third-party vendors to plug into CTRMA's toll system to facilitate transaction processing and promote data sharing with consultants and the general public.

<u>Current Action</u> - Under the proposed work authorizations Fagan Consulting will continue to provide qualified technical and professional personnel to perform duties and responsibilities at the request of the Mobility Authority. <u>Previous Actions</u> – At its July 24, 2019 meeting the CTRMA Board approved a one-year contract extension of the agreement with Fagan Consulting in an amount not to exceed \$1,318,626 – the amount specified in the FY 2020 budget.

 - 4. comments related to all submitted documentation regarding efforts described above; and

5. as may be identified in writing by the Authority from time to time.

Section B. – Service Providers
