

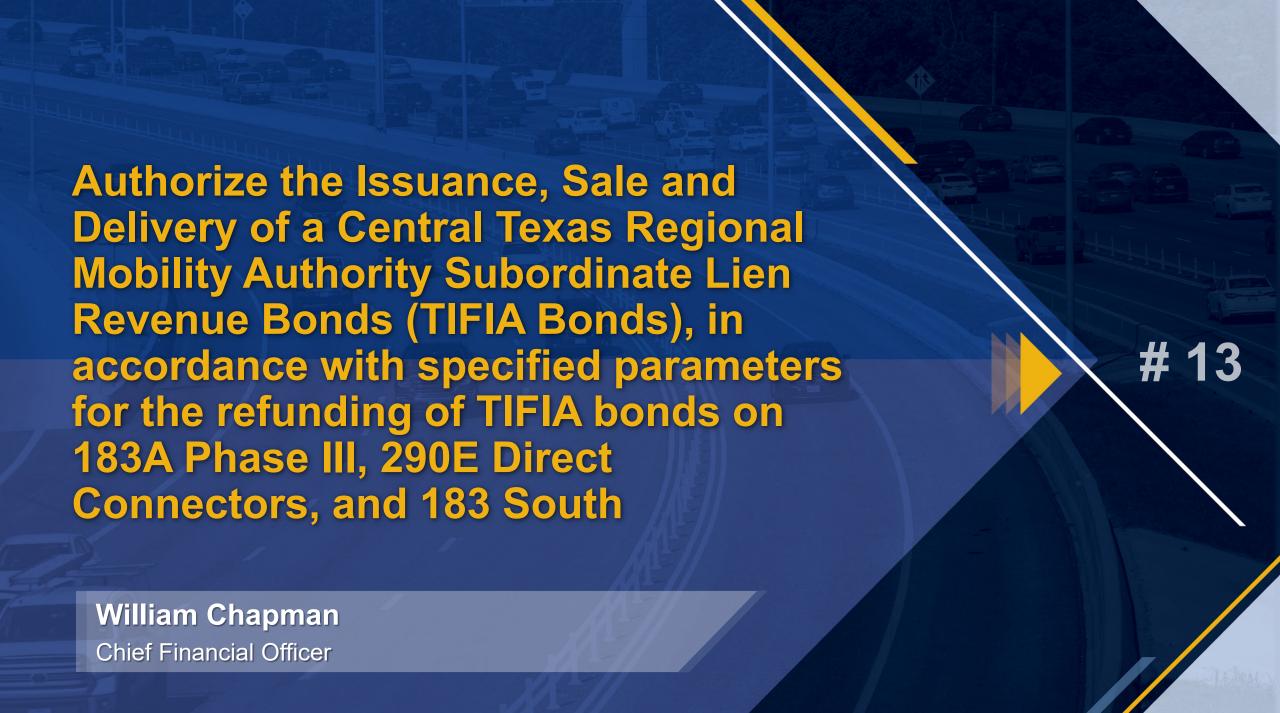

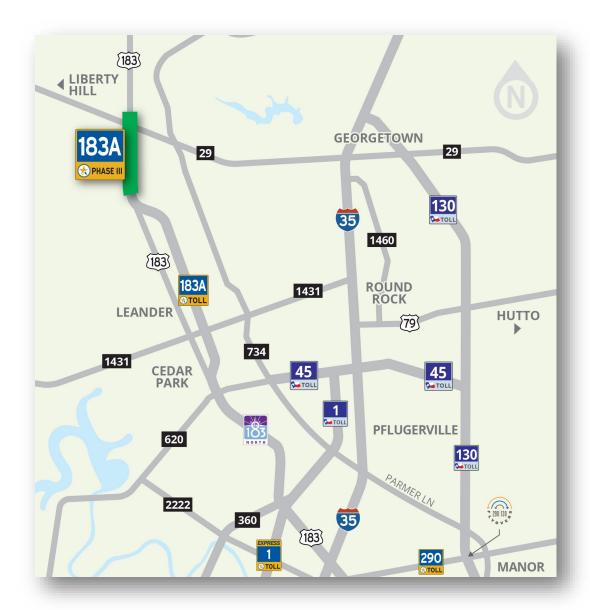

183A Phase III Project Overview



- » Project Description:
 Construction of two tolled lanes in each direction and shared-use path facilities
- » Limits: From north of Hero Way to north of SH 29
- » Total Project Cost: \$277.3M
- » Construction Cost: \$175.7M
- » Anticipated Notice to Proceed:
 By March 29, 2021
- » Open to Tolling: End of 2024



Construction Engineering & Inspection Services

»Scope:

» Construction engineering, inspection, materials testing and acceptance, survey quality assurance, and environmental compliance

»Value:

- » Construction Engineering and Inspection Services (CE&I) ensure that the contractor builds to the plans and specifications as intended
- » These services help provide a high-quality project reducing long term maintenance obligations



CE&I Contract Fee & Term

»Not to Exceed Budget:

»\$20,969,549

»Work Authorization Term:

» November 2020 to Final Acceptance (Anticipated by December 2024)



Recommendation

- » Staff recommends the Board approve the contract for Construction Engineering & Inspection (CE&I) services with RS&H for the Project, and

Qualified Veteran Program Overview



- » Program implemented in November 2018
- » Eligible Texas license plates include Disabled Veterans as well as recipients of Purple Heart, Congressional Medal of Honor, Legion of Valor awards
- » Participants receive toll-free passage on all Mobility Authority-operated roads, <u>except</u> <u>MoPac Express Lanes</u>
- » Program participation is limited to one (1) vehicle per veteran, or for those who qualify for a hardship exemption, the limit is two (2) vehicles per veteran

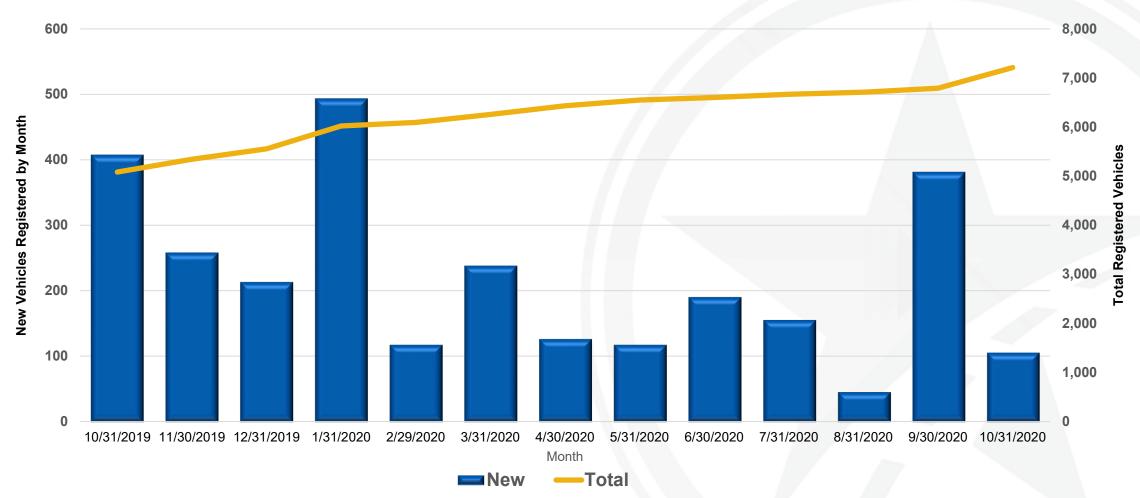




Qualified Veteran Program Participation

Prior 12 Months

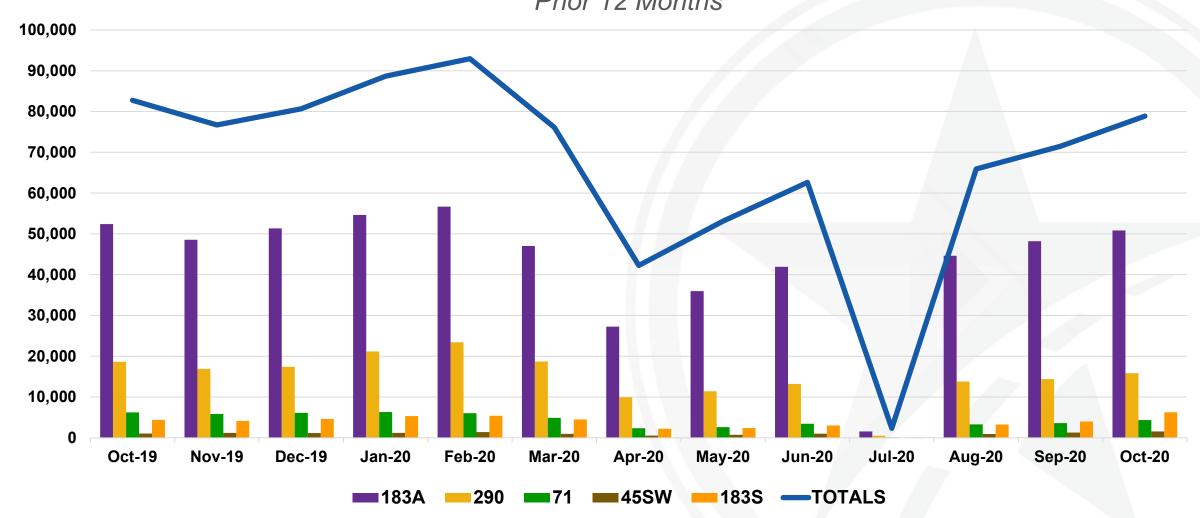




Program Transactions by Roadway





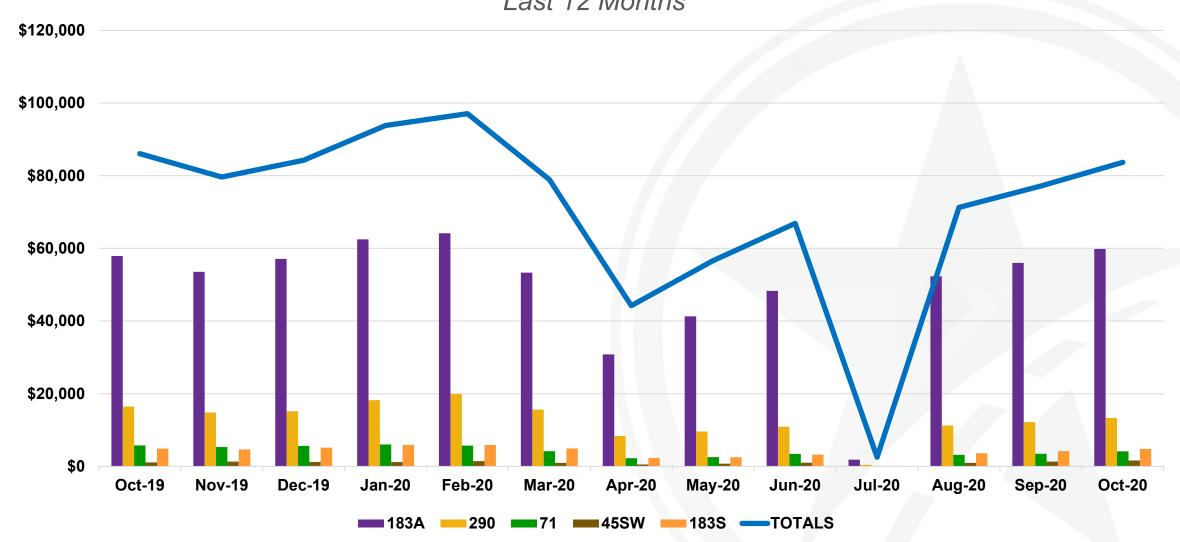




Program Revenue Impact by Roadway

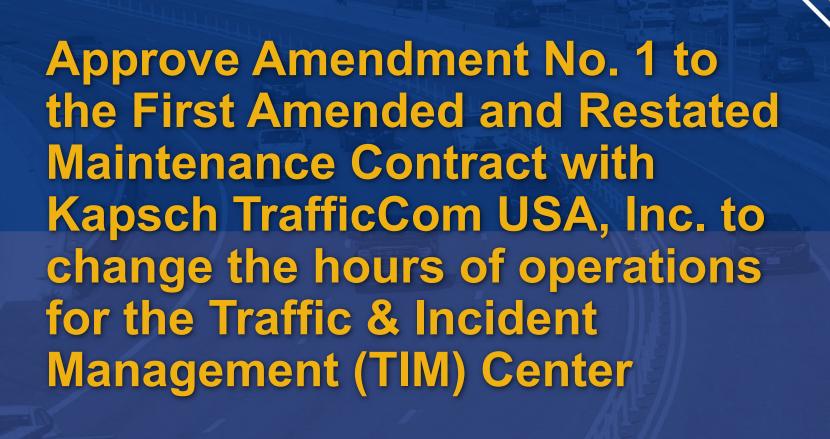
Interlocal Agreement Overview

- » Interlocal Agreement (ILA) grants non-exclusive rights to realtime traffic data including camera images/streams, traffic sensors, signs and communication links
- » This data exchange allows for more efficient traffic incident and management coordination to assist the Central Texas traveling public
- » Sharing this data permits TxDOT to coordinate with local law enforcement when the Mobility Authority's Traffic & Incident Management (TIM) Center is not staffed (weekdays 7:30p – 6:00a, weekends and holidays)
- » This is a no cost agreement that terminates five years after execution

Amend current language related to the TIM Center hours of operation

» Current language:

- "Staff the ELCC during peak hours and in operations from 5:30am 8pm, 5 days a week excluding holidays"
- "There will be 2 full-time equivalent ELCC Operators covering the following shifts, 13 hours per day and five (5) days per week:
 - Morning shift: 5:30 AM to 1:30 PM
 - Afternoon shift: 12:00 Noon to 8:00 PM

» Proposed language:

- "Staff the TIM Center during peak hours, five (5) days a week excluding holidays"
- "There shall be a minimum of two (2) full-time equivalent ELCC Operators covering two 8-hour shifts, one in the morning and one in the afternoon, five (5) days per week. The specific hours will be negotiated by Mobility Authority and Kapsch staff to ensure that TIM Center operations are sufficiently monitored."

Kapsch WA #2 Work Order Cost Summary

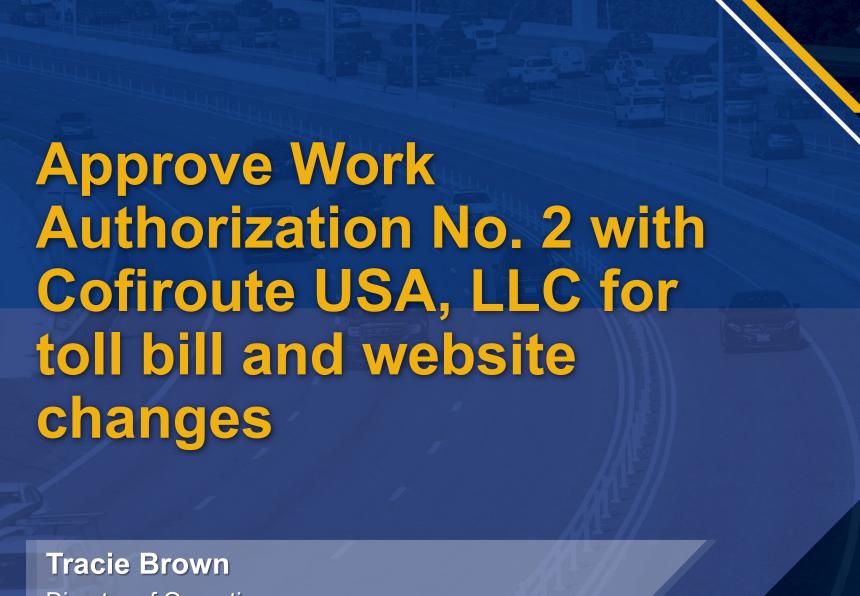
» Replace aging cameras and strobes on the 183A Toll Phases I & II and 290 Toll roadways

- » A total of 84 cameras will be purchased
- » New equipment will be installed at high-volume mainline gantries and old but newer models shifted to ramp locations
- » Action will reduce the number of toll transactions rejected due to poor image quality and increase the Authority's opportunity to collect the related revenue
- » Item budgeted in FY21 Capital Budget under Renewal & Replacement
- » The total cost of this Work Order is not to exceed \$936,006.56

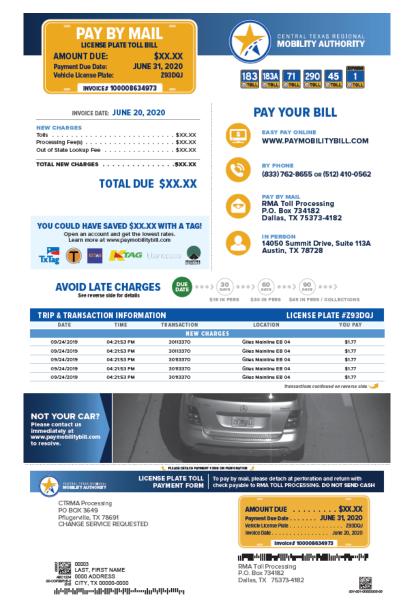


Cofiroute Work Authorization No. 2 Summary

- » Facilitate system changes required to support revamped Pay By Mail (PBM) bills and payment website
 - » Allows for a more complete picture for customers of their total balance owed
 - » Provides the ability for the Authority's PBM customers to use their invoice number and license plate to view and / or pay invoices and collections balances from a single screen and in a single step
 - » Implements changes to the invoice data file generation in support of the redesigned toll bill templates



NEW Toll Bill Design



- » License Plate Graphic: Introduce license plate graphic, summarizing only the most important content within for clearer messaging and payment paths
- » Charges: Simplify the charges / fees list to allow users to quickly understand their charges
- » Payment Methods: Better emphasize the different payment methods
- » Savings: Redesign so the Tag Savings messaging is easier to compare to promote benefits
- » Late Charges: Clearly outline a color-based progression of late charges and include a timeline graphic to improve transparency and define expectations
- » Trip and Transaction Table: Move the trip and transaction table to the first page to promote a better understanding of charges

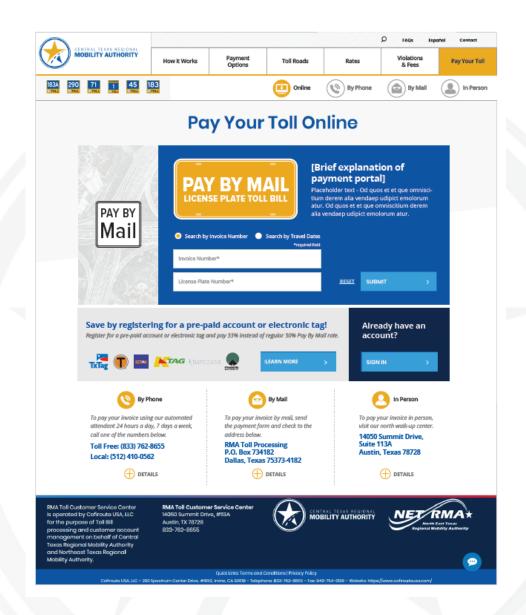
- » Different Color Palette: Introduce a new color palette to emphasize Past Due charges
- » Summarized Charges: Add previous charges to the comprehensive total so all charges owed are in single space. Add collections balance as well, but highlight it to draw attention
- » Late Charge Timeline: Change the Late Charge Timeline to align with the current stage of billing
- » Consistent Palette: Include new colors in the payment stub and "30 Days Past Due" messaging
- » New Information: Add a Trip and Transaction table to the Previous Charges section in the new color at the end of current charges table

NEW Combined Pay By Mail Website Design

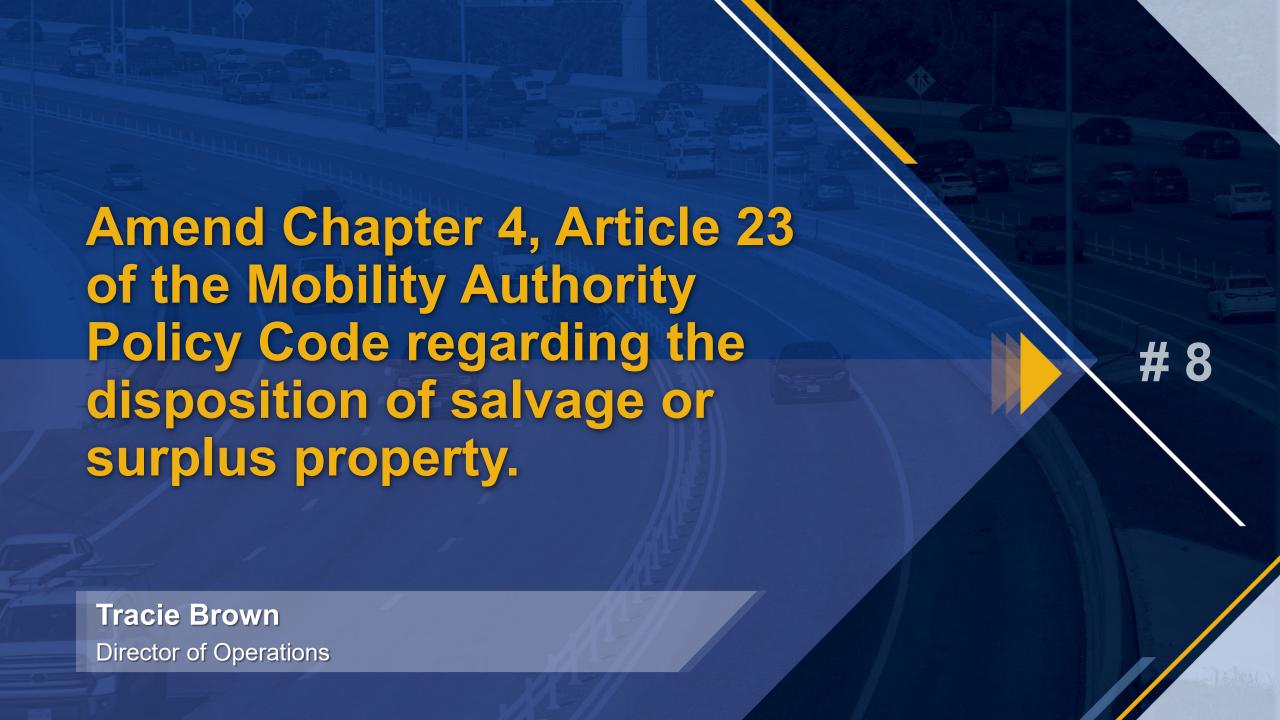
- » Consistent Branding: Redesign online payment portal so header and footer better match the Authority's brand and website, ans change the login boxes for both license plate customers and prepaid account customers and list ways users can pay on portal site
- » Program Consistency: Carry new license plate graphic into the agency site branding and online payment portal to help customers easily connect their PBM bill with its source
- » Focus Attention: Clearly separate logins for PBM customers and prepaid account customer, and replace the "Account #" with "Invoice #" and make login boxes for each customer type visually unique
- » Simplify: Consolidate paymobilitybill.com content and migrate it to Authority's agency site https://www.mobilityauthority.com/pay-your-toll





Staff Recommendation

- » Staff recommends approval of Work Authorization No. 2 with Cofiroute USA, LLC for toll bill and website changes





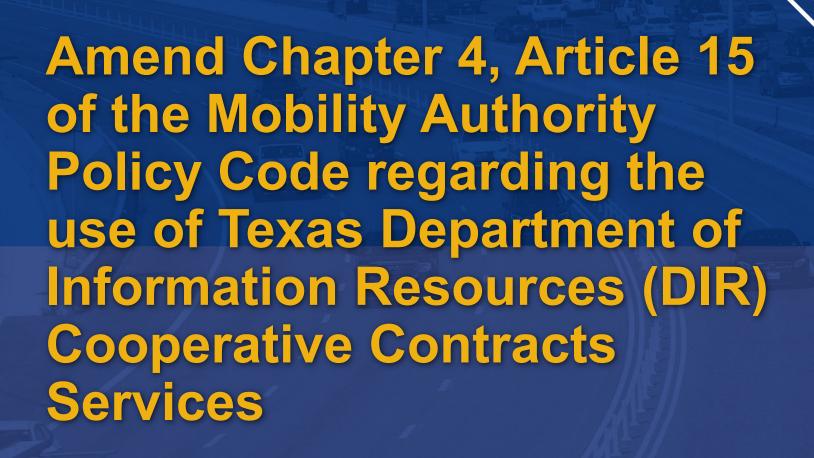
Policy Code Change Overview

- » Surplus property is assets and/or inventory that is obsolete, damaged, worn out and of no use to the agency
- » Examples of surplus property includes furniture, computers, printers, monitors, toll equipment, etc.
- » This Policy Code change adds language allowing this property to be recycled if determined to be in the best interest of the Mobility Authority
